## Natural gas is not poisonous

It does not contain carbon monoxide, the so-called "Gas Poisoning." However, when burning gas or any fuel, carbon monoxide can be produced by lack of air, improperly working appliances or poor flue conditions. As a basic precaution be sure that the flue connections and venting are always in perfect working order — unobstructed and properly fitted.

## Gas is a marvelous servant

Whether you use it for cooking, to heat water, dry clothes, heat or air condition your house, natural gas is a marvelous servant, especially when conserved and used properly. Gas is dependable. Natural gas has a safety record that is outstanding. We work constantly to keep it that way.

If you smell or hear natural gas, leave the area immediately and call 911.

Call 811 before you dig to prevent damage to natural gas lines.

Not reporting possible leaks and/or damaged lines could result in injuries or damages.

Scratch and sniff the box below the flame... then let your family sniff too.

Natural gas is odorless. The odor you smelled when you sniffed the flame is a chemical added to natural gas so you can detect even the smallest amount that might escape. Everyone should be able to recognize it and associate it with natural gas.
