Executive Summary of issue - Background

Shelby City Park will host Tar Heel Leagues State Tournaments July 19th through 22nd. These tournaments will feature 4 Shelby host teams and combine to have a total of 48 girls' softball teams with 800 players and coaches participating in the 4-day events. The tournaments will consist of 8 teams in the Tar Heel 15 & Under, 8 teams in the Tar Heel 12 & Under, 8 teams in Tar Heel 10 & Under, 12 teams in the Tar Heel 8 & Under Coach Pitch, and 12 teams in the Tar Heel 8 & Under Machine Pitch division.

Several hundred spectators are expected to be on hand daily until the Sunday championship games. There will be a total of nearly 90 games played at both the Ballfield Complex and the Recreation and Sports Complex.

That statement is not subject to judicial review.

ANALYSIS: This 4,000 Square Foot property is located at 502 Booker Street adjacent to a former textile mill. The Former mill is used for variety of warehousing currently. Other land uses in the area include single family dwelling, neighborhood commercial uses and institutional uses.


The LI Light Industrial District is primarily intended to accommodate limited manufacturing, warehousing, wholesaling, and related commercial and service activities which have little or no adverse impact upon adjoining residential, business, and industrial properties. The preservation of land for light industrial use is a major objective of the LI District. The LI District is intended to provide appropriate locations for light industrial uses in areas that are not adversely impacted by general or heavy industrial uses. Other land uses allowed within the LI District should be limited to those uses that support light industrial uses. Generally, retail and heavy commercial uses should be avoided in the LI District.

The R6 Residential District is primarily intended to accommodate a variety of high density single-family detached dwellings, modular homes, apartments, townhomes, and condominiums. Maximum densities within the R6 District range from approximately 7 dwelling units per gross acre for single-family detached dwellings to over 19 dwellings per gross acre for multifamily dwellings.

This house has been vacant since the previous owner passed away approximately 6 years ago. The current owner has possessed the property since December of 2014. Single family dwellings are not a permitted use in the LI Zoning District. The dwelling has previously been a nonconforming use, however, when a nonconforming use is vacant for more than 365 days the nonconforming use cannot be used again. Therefore, the owner has petitioned the City to rezone the property to R6 in order to renovate the structure and possibly lease it.

STAFF COMMENTS: The Comprehensive Land Use Plan for this area designates the site as Mixed Use. A mixed use area is intended to concentrate a mix if commercial uses and higher density residential uses. The proposed zoning map amendment is consistent with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan. However, the proposed zoning will create a substandard lot of record. A substandard lot of record is a lot created prior to the adoption of the current UDO that does not meet the dimensional requirements for the zoning district for which it is located. A substandard lot of record may be used for a Single Family Dwelling provided setback dimensions are met.

Item 3. Proposed Major Subdivision – Edgewater

Mr. Scharer presented this proposed Major Subdivision. This subdivision preliminary plat has an area of approximately 36.57 acres with fifteen (15) lots. The average lot size is more than 2 acres.

The applicant intends to build a Very Low Volume Local Road which is a street with a primary function to provide access to no more than 20 abutting properties with a Minimum Lot Size of One Acre. Average Daily Traffic count is no more than 400 vehicle trips per day. According to standard traffic generation tables, this subdivision will generate approximately 150 vehicle trips per day.

This proposed subdivision is consistent with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan (2009).

Motion: Mr. Carter made the motion to approve the preliminary plat for Edgewater Subdivision.

Second: Mr. Hamrick.

Action: This motion passed unanimously.

<u>Item 4.</u> <u>Proposed Zoning Map Amendment 502 Booker Street</u>

Mr. Scharer presented this proposed zoning map amendment. Land uses in this area include industrial, single family residential, and institutional uses. Single family dwellings are not permitted uses in the LI zoning district. This single family dwelling has been vacant for more than 5 years, therefore, may not be used as a nonconforming use.

The LI Light Industrial District is primarily intended to accommodate limited manufacturing, warehousing, wholesaling, and related commercial and service activities which have little or no adverse impact upon adjoining residential, business, and industrial properties. The preservation of land for light industrial use is a major objective of the LI District. The LI District is intended to provide appropriate locations for light industrial uses in areas that are not adversely impacted by general or heavy industrial uses. Other land uses allowed within the LI District should be limited to those uses that support light industrial uses. Generally, retail and heavy commercial uses should be avoided in the LI District.

The R6 Residential District is primarily intended to accommodate a variety of high density single-family detached dwellings, modular homes, apartments, townhomes, and condominiums. Maximum densities within the R6 District range from approximately 7 dwelling units per gross acre for single-family detached dwellings to over 19 dwellings per gross acre for multifamily dwellings. Public water and sewer service is generally available in areas zoned as R6.

Mr. Scharer noted the Comprehensive Land Use Plan designates this mixed use. Mr. Scharer asked if there were any questions concerning the proposal. Discussion followed. Mr. Hamrick asked if a timeline could be place on rehabilitation of the structure. Mr. Scharer stated zoning cannot be used for such a timeline. However, the minimum housing ordinance does impose a timeline.

1) Recognition of Justin S. Merritt, Finance Director, and the City of Shelby's Finance Department as recipients of the Certificate of Achievement for

Excellence in Financial Reporting awarded by the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2017

Acknowledging a long legacy, Mayor Anthony was pleased to announce that the Government Finance Officers Association awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting to the City of Shelby for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the 21st year. It is a testament to the commitment of past and present management and finance directors, whose work is often taken for granted, as to full public disclosure and communication of the financial condition of the City of Shelby.

Mr. Merritt acknowledged Mrs. Beam as primarily responsible for preparing the award-winning CAFR. He also explained it is a beneficial document which demonstrates a constructive spirit of full disclosure to clearly communicate the City's financial story and to motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR.

Mayor Anthony recognized and congratulated Mr. Merritt and Assistant Finance Director Beth Beam as they accepted the Certificate of Achievement on behalf of the City.

C. Unfinished Business:

1) Consideration of a resolution of tentative award for the Runway Overlay Project at Shelby-Cleveland County Regional Airport to Harrison Construction Company, Division of APAC-Atlantic, Inc.: Resolution No. 28-2018

Mr. Howell introduced Resolution No. 28-2018 for Council's consideration. If approved, this resolution would award a contract in the amount of \$2,468,006.75 to Harrison Construction Company, Division of APAC-Atlantic, Inc. for the construction of the Runway Overlay Project at the Shelby Cleveland County Regional Airport. This project has been approved by the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Division of Aviation for funding and has also received an award recommendation from the consulting engineering firm, W. K. Dickson & Co., Inc. A 10 percent local match is required and the County has again agreed to share this match with the City. This amounts to \$126,036.00 for each entity.

Next, Mr. Yarboro summarized the Runway Overlay Project by stating the current 5,002 foot runway exhibits significant cracking along joints within the asphalt and has extremely faded pavement markings. Based on these field observations and recent asphalt evaluations by the NC Division of Aviation, it was determined by the NC Division of Aviation and the City's engineering

consultant, W. K. Dickson, that an asphalt overlay project on the existing asphalt runway was the best solution to address the existing issues with the runway. In February 2016, the City was notified of a grant award for the design and construction of the Runway Overlay Project. After completing the grant acceptance process, the construction plans were designed and a public bid opening was conducted in March 2018. Following this bid opening, a negotiation process occurred with the low bidder, Harrison Construction Company, Division of APAC-Atlantic, Inc., to reach a final construction cost of \$2,428,713.75. Funding for this final construction cost is available in the State grant that was previously awarded. The total grant amount including the related professional services is \$2,520,715.75 with a 10 percent local match of \$252,071.75.

Mr. Yarboro provided the scope of the Runway Overlay Project as follows:

- Repairing existing cracks in asphalt via routing, filling, etc.
- Completing a 2-inch asphalt overlay on the runway and connectors between the runway and parallel taxiway.
- Reflective pavement markings will be installed in accordance with current Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) standards. This increased visibility directly improves the safety of all approaching aircraft.
- Increasing the weight rating of the runway in an effort to prevent asphalt damage from heavier aircraft.
- The new asphalt surface will greatly reduce the occurrence of aggregate breaking loose from the cracks in the existing asphalt. This reduces the major concern of foreign object debris (FOD) striking aircraft.
- It is anticipated that this project will add approximately 15 years to the life expectancy of the pavement.

Mr. Yarboro concluded with the construction on this project is anticipated to begin in early August 2018, which will result in a 21-day runway closure. He stated work should be substantially completed and the runway re-opened by September 1, 2018.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. Amaya, City Council voted unanimously to approve and adopt Resolution No. 28-2018 entitled, "A RESOLUTION OF TENTATIVE AWARD FOR THE RUNWAY OVERLAY

PROJECT AT SHELBY-CLEVELAND COUNTY REGIONAL AIRPORT TO HARRISON CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, DIVISION OF APAC-ATLANTIC, INC.".

2) Discussion regarding Royster Memorial Golf Course

Mr. Hendrick re-introduced the discussion as to how to effectively close the Royster Memorial Golf Course following the Alternative Use Study and Plan, previously presented by the City's consultants, Woolpert North Carolina, LLC.

Next, Mr. Howell explained the intent of the study was to identify future uses of the golf course property should closure eventually occur. The property would continue to be maintained so that it would not detract from the aesthetics of the City Park and neighboring properties. In the coming years, the City would hope to implement some of the ideas brought forth by the public for future use.

Council further discussed the significant decline in play on the golf course over time, the reduction of paid memberships over the years, and the increasing operational costs, all having been sufficiently evaluated. If the course does close in the near future, there will be a net savings to the City's taxpayers of approximately \$166,000.00 annually.

Mr. Howell clarified if Council wishes to implement some of the elements included in the Conceptual Master Plan, a planning process to seek additional input from the public as to the priorities and the long-term operational costs is necessary. The discussion always was if the golf course would close, what would be the options and which options were going to draw and benefit the most number of people. He reiterated it is important the alternatives put forth were still resonating with the public and were affordable, cost effective, and met the needs of the citizens.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. Hendrick, City Council voted 4 to 1 (Arth Dukes) to close the Royster Memorial Golf Course no later than November 1, 2018 and directing staff to bring forth recommendations of the best uses for the golf course property.

E. Public Hearing:

1) Proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2019 Annual Operating Budget for the City of Shelby

Mr. Howell reminded Council the proposed budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2019 has been presented, distributed, and made available for public inspection. As required by the North Carolina General Statutes, the public hearing notice has been advertised to allow public comment directly to Council for consideration prior to a formal vote.

Discussion followed and included how the closure of the golf course would affect the proposed budget. Mr. Howell responded with an approximate calculation of the annualized savings which would reduce the overall tax rate by ¾ cent or .0075 cent. Adding any new elements as proposed in the Conceptual Master Plan must go through the planning process of prioritization and costing in the future and will not impact this current proposed budget. However, the interim plan for closure of the golf course can be covered within the proposed budget.

Mayor Anthony opened the public hearing at 6:26 p.m. and invited comments from the public:

Jeff Yates who resides at 405 Edgewood Road in Shelby, North Carolina spoke in support of the proposed budget. Mr. Yates is a retired law enforcement officer who relocated from lowa to Shelby due to its safe environment. Through volunteer opportunities, he and his wife have met and know several Shelby police officers. Mr. Yates stated Shelby has a dedicated and professional staff in both the Police and Fire & Rescue Departments. He would like to continue feeling safe in Shelby and if the tax increase is needed to fund competitive wages to attract new hires and keep the current seasoned, knowledgeable, and professional officers on staff, then he and his wife are prepared to absorb and would support the tax increase. A fair and competitive wage would go a long way to keep Shelby a safe and desirable city and encourage economic growth as well.

Randy McSwain who resides at 110 Victoria Park Drive in Shelby, North Carolina stated he has extensive career experience in continuous improvement in the fields of engineering and management. Mr. McSwain suggested the City of Shelby consider utilizing the Lean Six Sigma principles in preparing its budget. He offered his expertise and services on a volunteer basis.

Mayor Anthony suggested Mr. McSwain schedule a meeting with the City Manager.

Mayor Anthony closed the public hearing at 6:35 p.m.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. Amaya, City Council voted 4 to 1 (Kittrell) to approve and adopt Ordinance No. 32-2018 entitled, "FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2018-2019 SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET ORDINANCE".

F. City Manager's Report:

- 1) Mr. Howell mentioned he is working with the Cleveland County Manager to draft an agreement relating to the construction of the Job Ready Shell Building No. 3 at the Foothills Commerce Center for Council's consideration.
- 2) Mr. Howell reported the Uptown Water and Sewer Project is proceeding and the work on Washington Street is nearing completion. Beginning June 11, 2018, Warren Street will be closed between Washington Street and Lafayette Street.
- 3) With regard to the City's various water infrastructure projects in support of the Clearwater Paper Corporation's expansion, Mr. Howell reported progress is being made and on track for completion on February 13, 2019.

G. Council Announcements and Remarks:

- 1) Mr. Amaya expressed his appreciation to all for their work on this budget while celebrating its completion.
- 2) Mr. White was pleased this budget allows the City of Shelby to be competitive with surrounding cities and counties. He also expressed his appreciation to all for the work being done and hoping for a great year.

- 4) Mayor Anthony recognized the generosity of the City's employees as he proudly announced the City of Shelby received a United Way Golden Eagle Award for the largest total campaign increase as well as a Chairman's Choice Eagle Award. Mr. Howell added the City of Shelby received its fourth United Way Spirit of North Carolina Award. Mrs. Jolly acknowledged Captain Brad Fraser of the Police Department and Battalion Chief Quentin Cash of the Fire and Rescue Department as recipients of the R. T. LeGrand, Jr. Outstanding Campaign Volunteers of the Year Award.





Review:



As you are aware, the City has several utility projects under construction that are needed to properly serve the Clearwater Paper facility expansion. The projects included are as follows:

- Farmville Road Natural Gas Loop Upgrade Project

These project budgets have been previously set based upon our engineer's best estimates available at the time. At this point, all of these projects have been bid, which provides the actual cost to complete the project. Therefore, some budgetary adjustments are necessary in order to bring to projects to completion. The attached ordinance, if approved, will simply re-distribute Cleveland County funding streams across the aforementioned projects. There is no increase in total revenues or expenditures, only a re-distribution from one project to the other. This is necessary as some project bids were under the anticipated budgets and some exceeded the anticipated budget.

Ordinance No. 36-2018 is presented for City Council consideration at this time via the Consent Agenda. If approved this ordinance would authorize additional appropriation of funds in the amount of \$83,641.50 from fund balance to study and design the conversion of Marion Street between Dekalb Street and Morgan Street to a three lane roadway section with two travel lanes and a dedicated center turn lane. This is similar to the design previously approved for Lafayette Street through uptown.

Initial discussions in early 2017 with NCDOT did not give us the indication they would be willing to entertain conversion of this section of Marion Street to three lanes. However, after more detailed conversations local NCDOT staff has indicated that they now are willing to move in that direction. There is a possibility we can secure some cost sharing on the project as well.

It is my recommendation Ordinance No. 36-2018 be adopted and approved by City Council at this time via the Consent Agenda.

Background

During the planning and design phase of the Shelby Streetscape Project, NCDOT representatives requested a meeting with the City of Shelby Engineering Department to address safety issues with the Marion St. & Lafayette St. intersection. It was determined that NCDOT was interested in redesigning Marion St. to create a 3-lane section (2 through lanes with a dedicated center turn lane) to reduce the frequency of left turn accidents from vehicles turning from Marion St. to Lafayette St.

Review

At the request of NCDOT, the City requested a proposal from Stantec (consultant designing the Shelby Streetscape Project) to revise the design to include changing Marion St. from Dekalb St. to Morgan St. to a 3-lane section (2 through lanes with a dedicated center turn lane). In addition, bulb-outs along this corridor and parking width dimension will be modified to accommodate the new lane configuration. These changes will require signal modifications at three intersections (Marion/Dekalb, Marion/Washington, and Marion/Lafayette). Stantec has provided a proposal for completing the necessary traffic analysis, survey, roadway design, signal design and construction document preparation work for a fee of \$83,641.50.

Recommendation

City Staff recommends a budget amendment in the amount of \$83,641.50 to allow Stantec to complete the design for the Marion Street Improvements as part of the Shelby Streetscape Project.

Background

In 2012, the City of Shelby received a grant from the North Carolina Division of Aviation for "Land Acquisition & Easements (Runway 5 & 23 RPZ)" and these state funds were allocated under the State Aid to Airports Program. Following the award of this \$808,500 grant (10% local match), the City worked closely with our airport consultant, W.K. Dickson, on acquisitions and easements that were identified on our Airport Layout Plan. During this project, the City has acquired 9 properties through fee simple transactions and has also acquired avigation easements on 3 additional properties. We are currently in the last phase of this project and have three additional properties that offers have been accepted on and are awaiting closings. An estimate showing a funding shortfall of \$328,000 and map showing the remaining acquisitions (attached for reference) was provided the NCDOA summarizing the expenses exceeding the grant amount for this project. The NCDOA has recommended \$330,000 of additional funding for this project to the NC Board of Transportation. If this budget amendment is approved, the City will close on the 3 remaining properties in June 2018.


Recommendation





The City Clerk is further directed to transmit by certified mail, return receipt requested, to each owner of property abutting on said street a copy of this Resolution of Intent and shall cause a notice of the Public Hearing to be prominently posted in at least two places along the subject street.

Section 4. This Resolution of Intent shall become effective upon its adoption and approval.
