Mayor Anthony called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance. The Mayor gave the invocation and Mr. White the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

A. Approval of agenda:

1) Motion to adopt the proposed agenda

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. Amaya, City Council voted unanimously to approve the agenda as presented.

B. Special Presentation:

1) Presentation of Advanced Law Enforcement Certificate awarded to Shelby Patrol Officer Brandon Todd Spangler

Mayor Anthony called upon Patrol Officer Brandon Todd Spangler. Officer Spangler recognized members of his immediate family, his mother, father, wife, and daughter, as well as his fellow officers and co-workers in attendance. The Mayor formally read and presented the Advanced Law Enforcement Certificate awarded by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission to Officer Spangler, adding his congratulations.

Referring to a career milestone, the Mayor noted this Advanced Law Enforcement Certificate is the highest recognition awarded to a dedicated

law enforcement officer by the State of North Carolina. It is earned based on a combination of education, professional training, and on-the-job experience as exemplified by Officer Spangler.

D. Unfinished Business:

- 1) Consideration of appointments to City advisory boards and commissions:
 - a. Shelby Cleveland County Regional Airport Advisory Board

Mrs. Parduski reported the terms of four incumbents, Richard Fletcher, Eric Bester, Paul Hounshell, Jr., and Billy Wright, conclude February 2019. All of the incumbents are seeking reappointment to this board.

Mr. Amaya nominated Richard Fletcher, Eric Bester, Paul Hounshell, Jr., and Billy Wright for reappointment.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. Amaya, City Council voted unanimously to close the nominations and accept the nominees by acclamation.

2) Consideration of an ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances, City of Shelby, North Carolina, by revising Chapter 38, Article 1, Section 38-3. Residential Collection Services: Ordinance No. 10-2019

Mr. Howell introduced Ordinance No. 10-2019 for Council's consideration. In response to concerns and complaints, he recommended an amendment to Section 38-3 for residential collection services which proposes residential refuse containers be placed at curbside prior to collection and be removed on the same day of scheduled collection. Mr. Howell added any resident of the City who violates the provisions of this ordinance is subject to the enforcement set forth in Section 38-4, as appropriate.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mrs. Arth Dukes, City Council voted unanimously to approve and adopt Ordinance No. 10-2019 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF SHELBY, NORTH CAROLINA, BY REVISING CHAPTER 38, ARTICLE 1, SECTION 38-3. RESIDENTIAL COLLECTION SERVICES".

E. New Business:

1) Consideration of an ordinance amending the City of Shelby's Schedule of Fees to include a fee schedule for Hanna Park: Ordinance No. 11-2019

Mr. Holtzclaw introduced Ordinance No. 11-2019 for Council's consideration. He stated the City of Shelby has an adopted fee schedule for facility rentals at all of its existing parks. Hanna Park will be opened for public use in the spring of 2019. In addition to six multi-purpose sports fields, six picnic shelters and one large picnic pavilion are included in the park. Mr. Holtzclaw added all of these facilities will be offered to the public for rental to host sporting events, family and corporate gatherings, and more. He requested and recommended approval of the updated Parks and Recreation fee schedule to include the facilities at Hanna Park.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. Amaya, City Council voted unanimously to approve and adopt Ordinance No. 11-2019 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF SHELBY'S SCHEDULE OF FEES TO INCLUDE A FEE SCHEDULE FOR HANNA PARK".

F. City Manager's Report:
