A councilman serving as mayor pro tempore shall be entitled to vote on all matters and shall be considered a councilman for all purposes, including the determination of whether a quorum is present. During the absence of the mayor, the council may confer upon the mayor pro tempore any of the powers and duties of the mayor. If the mayor should become physically or mentally incapable of performing the duties of his office, the council may by unanimous vote declare that he is incapacitated and confer any of his powers and duties on the mayor pro tempore. Upon the mayor's declaration that he is no longer incapacitated, and with the concurrence of a majority of the council, the mayor shall resume the exercise of his powers and duties. In the event both the mayor and the mayor pro tempore are absent from a meeting, the council may elect from its members a temporary chairman to preside in such absence. (1971, c. 698, s. 1; 1979, 2nd Sess., c. 1247, s. 4.)

City Manager's Recommendation / Comments

This time is scheduled on the agenda for City Council to conduct the required public hearing in accordance with the NC General Statutes. Following the conclusion of the hearing the Council may act on the item under consideration. A certified recommendations from the Planning and Zoning Board is included as part of the packet. I would call attention to Mr. Longino's information packet noting that the zoning map amendment is **consistent** with the City's current land use plan. I would further note that the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Board is advisory in nature only and that as a legislative matter Council has broad discretion to take action it believes is in the best interests of the City. City Council has adopted plans and established an advisory board for the purposes of providing reasonable guidance in the decision-making process.

The Planning and Zoning Board recommends approval of the proposed conditional zoning map amendment for property located east of Thrift Road and Nancy Drive, having Cleveland County parcel numbers 21879, 22277, 63932, and 63473 from Residential R20 zoning district and County zoning to Residential R6 Conditional Zoning (R6-CZ) district.

The following excerpt from the NC General Statutes is provided as a reminder as to the statutory guidance provided to Council when considering changes in zoning and development regulations.

§ 160D-605. Governing board statement.

- (a) Plan Consistency. When adopting or rejecting any zoning text or map amendment, the governing board shall approve a brief statement describing whether its action is consistent or inconsistent with an adopted comprehensive plan. The requirement for a plan consistency statement may also be met by a clear indication in the minutes of the governing board that at the time of action on the amendment the governing board was aware of and considered the planning board's recommendations and any relevant portions of an adopted comprehensive plan. If a zoning map amendment is adopted and the action was deemed inconsistent with the adopted plan, the zoning amendment shall have the effect of also amending any future land-use map in the approved plan, and no additional request or application for a plan amendment shall be required. A plan amendment and a zoning amendment may be considered concurrently. The plan consistency statement is not subject to judicial review. If a zoning map amendment qualifies as a "large-scale rezoning" under G.S. 160D-602(b), the governing board statement describing plan consistency may address the overall rezoning and describe how the analysis and policies in the relevant adopted plans were considered in the action taken.
- (b) Additional Reasonableness Statement for Rezonings. When adopting or rejecting any petition for a zoning map amendment, a statement analyzing the reasonableness of the proposed rezoning shall be approved by the governing board. This statement of reasonableness may consider, among other factors, (i) the size, physical conditions, and other attributes of the area proposed to be rezoned, (ii) the benefits and detriments to the landowners, the neighbors, and the surrounding community, (iii) the relationship between the current actual and permissible development on the tract and adjoining areas and the development that would be permissible under the proposed amendment; (iv) why the action taken is in the public interest; and (v) any changed conditions warranting the amendment. If a zoning map amendment qualifies as a "large-scale rezoning" under G.S. 160D-602(b), the governing board statement on reasonableness may address the overall rezoning.
- (c) Single Statement Permissible. The statement of reasonableness and the plan consistency statement required by this section may be approved as a single statement. (2019-111, s. 2.4; 2020-3, s. 4.33(a); 2020-25, s. 51(a), (b), (d).

Background

True Homes, LLC (on behalf of William and James Rucker) has submitted a petition for annexation and conditional zoning at the end of Thrift Road (east of Nancy Drive). This request, if approved, would become effective January 9th, 2024 and would be contingent upon approval of the annexation request on January 8th, 2024.

ANALYSIS: The subject property off Borders Road near the Mall with direct access to Thrift Road and Nancy Drive in the Rucker Downs Subdivision. The site is currently vacant and has an area of approximately 80 acres. The applicant is proposing to rezone the site to R6-CZ to accommodate a single-family subdivision with 213 proposed lots with lot widths ranging from 41 to 66 feet wide. The average lot size is 7,100 square feet with a density of 2.67 dwelling units per acre. Sidewalks are required for the internal streets. A very small portion of this site is currently zoned R-20. The remainder of this site is in the Cleveland County zoning jurisdiction. The applicant has requested annexation of this property to have access to City sewer to accommodate this density.

STAFF COMMENTS: The applicant is requesting R6-CZ to allow for smaller lot sizes. However, this conditional zoning application leverages the cluster subdivision option to provide an overall density of 2.67 homes per acre. The Comprehensive Land Use Plan identifies this property as being in a Medium Density Residential area. This proposal is




consistent with the Comprehensive Future Land Use Plan. Staff and Planning Board recommend this proposed conditional Zoning Map Amendment.


Please schedule a legislative public hearing for this proposed conditional zoning amendment at the next City Council meeting on December 4, 2023.

Maximum Building Height:

a. Site Location. These Development Standards form a part of the Rezoning Plan associated with the Rezoning Petition filed by True Homes ("Petitioner") to accommodate the development of a residential community on approximately 79.86 acre site generally located at the east end of Thrift Road and east of Nancy Drive (the "Site").

Rezoning Plan as well as the applicable provisions of the City of Shelby Unified Development Ordinance in existence as of the date of approval of the Rezoning (the "Ordinance"). Unless the Rezoning Plan establishes more stringent standards the regulations established under the Ordinance for the R6 Cluster zoning classification shall

rights-of-way, streets and other development matters and site elements (collectively the "Development/Site Elements") set forth on the Rezoning Plan should be reviewed in conjunction with the provisions of these Development Standards. The layout, locations, sizes and formulations of the Development/Site Elements depicted on the Rezoning Plan are graphic representations of the Development/Site elements proposed. Changes to the Rezoning Plan not anticipated by the Rezoning Plan will be reviewed and approved as allowed by Article VIII of the Ordinance.

Since the project has not undergone the design development and construction phases, it is intended that this Rezoning Plan provide for flexibility in allowing some alterations or modifications from the graphic representations of the Development/Site Elements. Therefore, there may be instances where minor modifications will be allowed without requiring the Administrative Amendment Process per Article VIII of the Ordinance. These instances would include changes to graphics if they are minor and do not materially change the overall design intent depicted on the Rezoning Plan.

The Planning + Development Services Director will determine if such minor modifications are allowed per this amended process, and if it is determined that the alteration does not meet the criteria described above, the Petitioner shall then follow process per Article VIII of the Ordinance; in each instance, however, subject to the Petitioner's appeal rights set forth in the Ordinance.

d. Number of Buildings Principal and Accessory. The total number of principal residential buildings to be developed on the Site shall not exceed 213. Accessory buildings and structures located on the Site shall not be considered in any limitation on the number of buildings on the Site. Accessory buildings and structures will be constructed utilizing similar building materials, colors, architectural elements and designs as the principal buildings located on the Site.

& Development Area Limitation:

a. The Site may be developed with up to 213 single-family detached residential dwellings together with accessory uses allowed in the R6 Cluster zoning district as generally depicted on the Rezoning Plan.

Access and Transportation Improvements:

a. Access to the Site shall be from Thrift Road and Nancy Drive and the proposed public streets as generally depicted on the Rezoning Plan. The placement and configuration of the access points are subject to any minor modifications required by City of Shelby in accordance with applicable published standards.

b. The alignment of the internal vehicular circulation and driveways may be modified by the Petitioner to accommodate changes in traffic patterns, parking layouts and any adjustments required for approval by City of Shelby in accordance with applicable published standards.

All on-site right-of-way dedication will be completed as required by Article XV.

Open Space:

a. Common open space area(s) may include, but not limited to, hardscape, gathering areas, seating opportunities, landscaping, natural paths, and/or other similar features.

a. The building materials used on the principal buildings constructed on Site may be a combination of portions of the following: brick, stone, precast stone, precast concrete, synthetic stone, cementitious fiber board, stucco, EIFS, decorative block, vinyl (vertical, horizontal, or shake style) and/or wood. General Design Guidelines:

b. Pitched roofs, if provided, shall be symmetrically sloped no less than 4:12, except that roofs for porches and attached sheds may be no less than 2:12.

Environmental Features:

a. The Site will comply with adopted City of Shelby Stormwater Development Requirements. The location, size and type of storm water management systems depicted on the Rezoning Plan are subject to review and approval as part of the full development plan submittal and are not implicitly approved with this rezoning. Adjustments may be necessary in order to accommodate actual storm water treatment requirements and natural site discharge points.

All new lighting shall meet City of Shelby Development Standards.

Amendments to the Rezoning Plan:

a. Future amendments to the Rezoning Plan (which includes these Development Standards) may be applied for by the then Owner or Owners of the applicable Development Area portion of the Site affected by such amendment in accordance with the provisions of Article VIII of the Ordinance.

Binding Effect of the Rezoning Application:

a. If this Rezoning Petition is approved, all conditions applicable to the development of the Site imposed under the Rezoning Plan will, unless amended in the manner provided under the Ordinance, be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Petitioner and subsequent owners of the Site and their respective heirs, devisees, personal representatives, successors in interest or assigns.

ORDINANCE NO. 54-2023

A PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, NORTH CAROLINA FOR PARCELS 21879, 22277, 63473, and 63932

WHEREAS, the City of Shelby has received an application requesting the rezoning of property at Thrift Road and Nancy Drive (Parcels 21879, 22277, 63473, 63932) located within Cleveland County and contiguous to the City of Shelby; and,

WHEREAS, the Shelby Planning and Zoning Board has reviewed said application for a zoning change and has made its findings and recommendations to City Council; and,

WHEREAS, the Shelby Planning and Zoning Board found that the zoning change is consistent with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan for the proposed land use; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with GS 160D-602, a public hearing on this proposed rezoning was held by City Council on December 4th after due publication of said hearing as required by law; and,

WHEREAS, after hearing all who wished to be heard on this matter and upon review of the findings and recommendations of the Planning and Zoning Board, City Council now desires to act on this matter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, NORTH CAROLINA:

Section 1. This zoning change is reasonable and in the public interest based on being consistent with the City of Shelby Comprehensive Land Use Plan for the proposed land use.

Section 2. In accordance with Chapter 160D et al of the North Carolina General Statutes, as amended, the Shelby Unified Development Ordinance and Shelby Zoning Map (Appendix A of the Shelby City Code), the property east of Nancy Drive and Thrift Road (Parcels 21879, 22277, 63473, 63932) is hereby amended from R20 Zoning District and Cleveland County Rural Zoning to R6 Conditional Zoning.

Section 3. The parcels amended by this ordinance are subject to the following conditions:

1. This site must be developed in accordance with the submitted site plan and development standards.

Section 4. The City Clerk of the City of Shelby is hereby authorized and directed to cause the provisions of Section 2 of this ordinance to be properly codified, and the City Clerk is further authorized and directed to cause her official records and the Official Zoning Map of the City of Shelby to be properly amended to reflect the approved zoning changes.

Mayor Anthony called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and delivered the invocation.

Mrs. Bullock led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Anthony asked Council member Andrew Hopper to come forward to present a replica of home plate to City Manager Rick Howell from the Executive Committee of the American Legion World Series in appreciation of the support the City has given to the American Legion World Series over the years.

Mayor Anthony acknowledged there are two agenda items that need to be added which are Consent item D-4(c), and Consent item D-5.

A. Approval of agenda:

1) Motion to adopt the proposed agenda as amended with the addition of D-4(C) and D-5.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion by Mr. White, City Council voted unanimously to approve the agenda as amended

B. Special Presentation:

1) Audit Presentation for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2023 - Martin Starnes and Associates, CPA's, P.A., Tonya Thompson, Senior Manager, presenting

Mrs. Beam introduced Tonya Thompson with Martin Starnes & Associates as the presenter of the annual audit report and Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) for Fiscal Year (FY) ended June 30, 2023.

Miss Thompson stated the Martin Starnes' report yielded an unmodified opinion, meaning the City's financials are not materially misstated and are fairly presented in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). Miss Thompson also acknowledged the assistance and cooperation of Mrs. Beam and the Finance Department's staff during the audit process.

Miss Thompson mentioned additional audit highlights:

- General Fund \$5.5 million increase in fund balance
- Enterprise Fund \$7.8 million increase in net position
- Property tax revenues \$219,000 increase from 2022
- 2023 Collection rate 97.67%

Miss Thompson summarized and compared General Fund revenues and expenditures for 2022 and 2023. In 2023, revenues increased by \$2.4 million, and expenditures increased by \$1.2 million.

Miss Thompson stated fund balance includes these five categories: Nonspendable, restricted, committed, assigned, and unassigned classifications, and serves as a measure of the City's available financial resources.

Regarding total fund balance for the General Fund, Miss Thompson noted there was an increase of \$5.5 million from 2022 to 2023.

Miss Thompson stated available fund balance as defined by the Local Government Commission (LGC) is calculated as Total Fund Balance less Nonspendable, less Stabilization by State Statute (restricted) which then equals Available Fund Balance. This calculation is utilized as the basis for comparing Shelby to other units of similar size as well as calculating fund balance percentages.

Miss Thompson reviewed Shelby's Fund Balance position in the General Fund:

Total Fund Balance \$22,487,200 Non-spendable \$ (598,682) Stabilization by State statute \$ (4,865,555) **Available Fund Balance 2023** \$17,022,963

Available Fund Balance 2022 \$10,416,047 Changes in Available Fund Balance \$6,606,916

Miss Thompson explained the new guidelines from the Local Government Commission (LGC) regarding fund balance available (FBA) excluding Powell Bill funding. Shelby's FBA as a requirement is a minimum of 25 percent. Miss Thompson further explained the LGC's median for units with General Funds expenditures of \$10 million such as Shelby is 46 percent. In 2023, Shelby's FBA is at 49.6 percent, so right on track.

Miss Thompson reported the top three sources of revenue include property taxes (48%), sales and services (9%), and other taxes and licenses (25%). All other revenues (18%) are included in a separate category which includes miscellaneous, investment earnings and permits and fees. The top three categories represent approximately 81% of total revenues or \$23.9 million. The total revenues for the general fund are \$29 million.

Miss Thompson further stated there was an increase of about \$219,000 or 2% in property taxes.

Regarding other taxes and licenses, Miss Thompson noted an increase of \$713,000 or 11% mainly caused by sales tax which has increased substantially over the last several years.

Regarding sales and services there was an increase of \$224,000 or 9%.

Miss Thompson reported the top three expenditures were public safety (54%), general government (13%), and cultural and recreation (10%). All other expenditures (23%) are included in a separate category which includes environmental protection, debt service and transportation. The top three expenditures are \$24.9 million combined which is 76.5 percent of total expenditures.

Miss Thompson stated public safety increased \$4.17 million, mainly due to costs such as salaries, benefits, radios, vehicles, and a fire engine.

Regarding general government, Miss Thompson commented expenditures increased by \$581,000 mainly due to salary increases and changes to internal cost allocations.

Regarding cultural and recreation category, Miss Thompson commented there was an increase of about \$255,000, mainly due to seasonal employees and capital outlay such as 8 new dugouts at Shelby City Park.

Regarding the City's enterprise funds, Miss Thompson reported an increase in total net position of \$7.8 million, stating the City has invested in capital assets this year.

Regarding the Water fund, the unrestricted net position is up \$1.2 million and cash flow from operations is down \$600,000. Miss Thompson explained the LGC is looking for the quick ratio to be above 1%, and our quick ratio in the Water fund is 2.60%.

Regarding the Sewer fund, the unrestricted net position increased \$1.87 million and cash flow from operations is down 21% to \$2.8 million. The Sewer fund quick ratio is 3.52%.

Regarding the Electric fund, the unrestricted net position increased \$2.35 million to \$13 million and cash flow from operations is up 23%. The Electric fund quick ratio is 7.05%.

Regarding the Natural Gas fund, the unrestricted net position is down \$2.48 million and cash flow from operations is down 11%. The Natural Gas fund quick ratio is 6.92%.

Miss Thompson reviewed the positive performance indicators, such as:

- General Fund balance in line with peer cities
- Enterprise fund quick ratios were over 1%
- Audit was timely submitted
- Stable property tax valuation and collection rate percentage

Miss Thompson stated there is one item that was considered a red flag, or a performance indictor of concern. The combined cash flow indicator for the water and sewer came out negative. Even though there were increases in the net position in water and sewer funds, a good portion of that increase was due to transfers and that doesn't count toward the ratio. The LGC requires a written, signed response with explanations and/or corrective actions by a majority of the City Council members, the City Manager, and the Finance Director within 60 days of tonight's audit presentation.

Mr. Howell advised Council that in the Consent agenda there is a response letter to be sent to the Local Government Commission regarding the performance indicator of concern.

- spoke to Council about the concerns she has on the development going on in her neighborhood. She is not impressed with the builder and the cookie cutter type neighborhood that is not typical of a Shelby community.
- 2) Cynitra Stewart, who resides at 416 McBrayer Street, Shelby, North Carolina stated she is a new business owner in the cyber technology field.

Mr. Howell presented this ordinance that would appropriate \$66,000 from the Sewer Fund net retained earnings for the purpose of expanding the original scope of the Wastewater Management and Hydraulic Modeling Survey to include additional areas on the western side of the City.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion by Mr. Webber, City Council voted unanimously to adopt Ordinance No. 53-2023 entitled, "A BUDGET ORDINANCE AMENDMENT FOR THE CITY OF SHELBY'S AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN WATER AND SEWER ASSET MANAGEMENT AND MODELING PROJECTS."

G. City Manager's Report:

The 2024 United Way campaign was a huge success this year with a total of \$217,768.72 donations from employees. This is an increase of over \$47,000 from 2023.

A severe drought situation is within the City's watershed, however, the triggers needed to initiate a Stage 1 Water Shortage Plan have not been reached yet. Mr. Wilson will continue to monitor the situation.

A Council Retreat date needs to be decided. Mr. Howell suggested January 27th or February 3rd as options. Council tentatively chose January 27th but will confirm that date at our December 4th meeting.

Mr. Howell also stated the January 1st and January 15th meetings are holidays. So, the January 1st meeting will be moved to January 8th and the January 15th meeting will be cancelled. By consensus, this was agreeable.

County Home Road bids are due tomorrow.

No grant information has been received on the Webbley house.

Expansion of the Rail Trail continues, and Depot Park final design and plans should be out for bid in the first quarter of 2024.

Staff is working to resolve a dispute on the cracking of the pool deck.

Mr. Longino will be working on the dog park and hope to have it completed in a timely fashion.

Mr. Howell updated Council on the status of TAMP Phase I and Phase II project. Phase I consists of 17 miles and paving is basically complete. Phase II consists of paving 15 miles and is upcoming soon. These 32 miles of paved streets are about \$6 million of the \$10 million approved by the voters.

The Crosstown Waterline project is ongoing, which will provide better water flow and pressure to the southern part of the city.

The Hickory Creek Sewer Outfall construction is underway and making slow progress with that project.

Water Treatment Plant Filtration Project should be starting soon.

Final touches of the City Hall roof are ongoing and should be finished soon.

H. Council Announcements and Remarks:

Mayor Anthony mentioned the Christmas tree lighting will be this Saturday, November 25th at 6:00 p.m. The Dancing Fleas will be performing as well.

Mr. White commended the City employees on their generosity to the United Way.

Mr. Causby acknowledged how nice the front of City Hall looks with the new sidewalk.

Mr. Webber wished everyone a happy and safe holiday season.

Mr. Hopper also mentioned the generosity of our employees. Also, he appreciated all the voters that voted this year.

Mayor Anthony mentioned next meeting will be the swearing in of our recently elected Council members.

a.) Ordinance No. 55-2023 is presented for Council consideration via the Consent Agenda. If approved this ordinance would appropriate \$500,000 of ARPA funds toward the construction of a public sewer lift station adjacent to the proposed Riverwalk subdivision. Council will recall that it adopted Resolution No. 68-2022 in November 2022 allocating the water and wastewater purposes for the \$10.2 million grant approved by the NC General Assembly during the 2022 session. \$2,000,000 of this amount was allocated for water and wastewater projects that would promote residential development within the city limits. Any amount above \$500,000 must be paid by the developer of the Riverwalk subdivision.

b.) Resolution No. 78-2023 is presented for City Council consideration via the Consent Agenda. If adopted this resolution would approve a utility extension agreement that provides for a cost sharing for the construction of a public wastewater lift station. It essentially provides that the City will allow for the construction of a new lift station, authorizes that the City will expend an amount not to exceed \$500,000 and requires the developer of the subdivision to pay costs above that amount.

It is my recommendation that Ordinance No. 55-2023 and Resolution No. 78-2023 be adopted and approved by City Council via the Consent Agenda at this time.

Subject: Project Budget Ordinance – Riverwalk Sewer Project

Background

The City of Shelby received \$6,382,000 in funding under the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to be used for water and sewer projects selected by the City. One of the projects selected was to build a lift station, associated force main and gravity sewer line extension located on College Avenue to serve the Riverwalk Subdivision. Council has approved the selection of Odom Engineering for the engineering work associated with the Riverwalk Sanitary Sewer Extension and Sewer Lift Station Project through resolution 40-2023 and have received their proposal.

Review

The City of Shelby will use the ARP funds for design, construction, and installation of the lift station, forcemain and gravity sewer line in the amount of \$500,000. The engineering costs for Odom Engineering is in the amount of \$62,500. The remaining funds of \$437,500 will be used for construction costs.

Recommendation

City staff recommend that a Project Budget Ordinance be created for the Riverwalk Sanitary Sewer Extension and Sewer Lift Station Project (Riverwalk Sewer Project) in the amount of \$500,000. Of this amount, \$62,500 is to be appropriated for engineering and \$437,500 appropriated to construction.

RESOLUTION NO. 40 - 2023

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SELECTION OF ODOM ENGINEERING BASED ON QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE DESIGN OF THE RIVERWALK SANITARY SEWER EXTENSION AND SEWER LIFT STATION LOCATED ON COLLEGE AVENUE

WHEREAS, City of Shelby has received plans for the Riverwalk Subdivision to be located near the intersection of Sam Lattimore Road and College Avenue in Shelby

WHEREAS, City Staff recognizes the need for a sanitary sewer extension and sewer lift station on College Avenue to serve the needs of the Riverwalk Subdivision; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Shelby is seeking to contract with a Professional Engineering firm licensed in the State of North Carolina to complete the survey, design, permitting, bidding, and construction engineering & inspection for a sewer lift station, associated force main, and gravity sewer lines for said subdivision; and,

WHEREAS, City staff issued a Request for Qualifications to Professional Engineering firms interested in providing design services and subsequently construction oversight contingent on the availability of funds related to this project in accordance with North Carolina General Statute 143-64.31; and,

WHEREAS, four (4) Statement of Qualifications were received from engineering firms interested in performing the work associated with this project; and,

WHEREAS, City Staff have reviewed the Statement of Qualifications and determined that Odom Engineering is the most qualified to perform the provided services as outlined in the Request for Qualifications.

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable provisions of the North Carolina Budget and Fiscal Control Act, the City of Shelby finds it advisable and necessary to establish a capital project ordinance and budgets for the City of Shelby's Riverwalk Sewer Project: and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City to establish a budget for this capital project and appropriate applicable funds needed for the administration and construction of this project in order to comply with applicable provisions of the North Carolina Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act; and,

Background

As noted in the attached memorandum from Brian Wilson, Director of Water Resources, the City of Shelby received approximately \$6.3M in funding under the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to be used for water and sewer projects in the City. Following receipt of this funding, City staff reviewed various planning documents and evaluated current system and service area needs. Through this process, a list of projects and priorities were established. The projects included in the previously approved resolution included:

- 24" Waterline from Morgan St. to South Tank and Forest Hills Drive
- Hickory Creek Sewer Windsor to Holly Oak
- Water Treatment Plan Filter Rehabilitation
- Water/Sewer Improvements to Promote Residential Development
- Water and Sewer System Repairs and Maintenance

This memorandum references a Project Budget Ordinance and Resolution related to the design and construction of a sewer lift station project that will provide sewer service to a 144-unit residential development on College Avenue near Riverbend Golf Course. The City of Shelby was approached by the owner/developer of this property regarding the need of a public sewer lift station to provide service to the property. The construction of this public lift station is the result of the topography of this property and the fact that there is no gravity sewer in this area that can be extended. In an effort to meet the goals of City Council, City Staff proposes that the City will spend up to \$500,000 towards the design, permitting, bidding, construction administration and construction of the necessary lift

station and the associated force main and gravity sewer mains. The developer will be responsible for all costs associated with this project in excess of the \$500,000 that the City will contribute. Additionally, the developer will be responsible for all additional water and sewer infrastructure that is required to provide service to the individual lots within this subdivision.

As detailed in the attached memo from Mr. Wilson, an agreement has been developed that states the roles and responsibilities of the City and the developer.

Recommendation

City Staff recommends approval of the Project Budget Ordinance and the Resolution that approves the Acceptance of Utility Extension Agreement for Residential Development for the Riverwalk Subdivision. If approved, City Staff will proceed with design and ultimately the construction and installation of the sewer lift station, associated force main and gravity sewer line extension to provide sewer service to the proposed 144-unit Riverwalk Subdivision.

Background

The City of Shelby received \$6,382,000 in funding under the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to be used for water and sewer projects selected by the City. On November 7th 2022, the Shelby City Council approved Resolution No. 68-2022 appropriating funding to support sewer system improvements that will promote residential growth.

The City was contacted by the owner/developer of a 96-acre property located on College Avenue near Riverbend Golf Course. This property owner completed the voluntary annexation process and has requested sewer service to this residential development. In order to provide sewer service, a lift station, associated force main and gravity sewer line extension must be constructed. This sewer system improvement will provide service to 144 proposed homes/townhomes. An agreement has been developed and reviewed by the City Attorney and City Staff that would be presented to developer to outline the requirements of the sewer infrastructure construction and utilization of up to \$500,000 in ARP funds.

Review

The City of Shelby would enter into an agreement where the City would fund a maximum of \$500,000 in the design, permitting, and construction of the lift station, associated force main and gravity sewer line necessary to service the Riverwalk Subdivision. The City will be reimbursed by the Developer for any cost above the maximum of \$500,000 ARP funds for the proposed utility extension. Currently there is an engineering proposal in the amount of \$\$62,500 for the design, bidding and construction administration for this project. The remaining amount to be funded by the City is \$437,500 of the City's total obligation of \$500,000 to go towards construction and installation of sewer utilities. As previously stated, all remaining costs would be the responsibility of the developer.

Recommendation

City Staff recommend that City Council approve the Acceptance of Utility Extension Agreement for Residential Development for the Riverwalk Subdivision. If approved, City Staff will proceed with design and ultimately the

construction and installation of the sewer lift station, associated force main and gravity sewer line extension for the proposed 144-unit Riverwalk Subdivision.

CITY OF SHELBY UTILITY EXTENSION AGREEMENT FOR RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT

THIS UTILITY EXTENSION AGREEMENT (hereafter "Agreement"), is made and
entered into as of theday of, 2023, by and between the City of Shelby,
a municipal corporation of the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the CITY, party
of the first part, andJBR Monopoly LLC ofShelby_ (city),North Carolina
(state), hereinafter referred to as the DEVELOPER(S), party of the second part.
WHEREAS, this Agreement relates to an assemblage of land of 96 acres, more or less, located at 1105 River Road in Shelby, NC, and described in Deed Book 1839 Page at the Cleveland County Register of Deeds and further described as Parcel Number(s) (collectively "the Property"); and,
WHEREAS, the DEVELOPER(S) requires water and sewer services for the development of the Property, and wishes to construct improvements that will connect to the CITY's water and sewer systems in order to enable development of the Project, including design, construction and installation of a sewer lift station, associated force main, and gravity sewer lines (as shown in Exhibit A); and,
WHEREAS, the DEVELOPER(S) is subject to the committed elements of a preliminary development plan, approved by the CITY on (as shown on Exhibit B), which binding commitments are incorporated herein by reference as if set out in full and consists of approximately _0_ square feet of office space, _0_ square feet of retail, _144_ residential units, and _0_ square feet of civic floor area; and,
WHEREAS, per City Ordinance, the DEVELOPER(S) is required to pay all costs associated with this proposed development, in particular the water and sewer infrastructure related to such systems, and other related costs; and,

WHEREAS, the CITY received funding under the American Rescue Plan (ARP) that is available for water and sewer projects. The CITY will contract with a Professional Engineering firm licensed in North Carolina to complete the survey, design, permitting, bidding, and construction engineering & inspections for a sewer lift station, associated force main, and gravity sewer lines as depicted in the preliminary layout included as Exhibit A. The CITY agrees to utilize a maximum of \$500,000.00 of ARP funds for the design, construction, and installation of the aforementioned sewer infrastructure project. CITY's designation of use of these funds is subject to DEVELOPER(S)' agreement to reimburse the CITY for any cost above \$500,000.00 to complete the survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, construction engineering and inspections, and installation of the sewer project. The DEVELOPER(S) shall review the proposed design and must provide written approval of the design prior to the Project being advertised and bid. This Project will be bid in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes and appropriate federal regulations pertaining to use of ARP funding for the project. The CITY will present the bid results to the DEVELOPER(S). The DEVELOPER(S) must provide written approval of the

CITY's recommendation of bid award for the project to proceed. Upon presentation to City Council and subsequent approval, the CITY will then enter into a Contract with the lowest, responsible bidder, taking into consideration quality, performance, and the time specified in the proposals for the performance of the contract. The DEVELOPER(S) also agrees to use City of Shelby water for this development project.

WHEREAS, DEVELOPER(S) further agree that should the DEVELOPER(S) not complete the grading associated with Phase I of this Project within two (2) years from the date of the written Notice to Proceed for the Sewer Project, DEVELOPER(S) shall reimburse the total cost incurred including the cost of the design plans, and any costs incurred associated with construction and installation, up to the amount of the final bid accepted for the survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, construction engineering & inspections and installation. To satisfy this condition, DEVELOPER(S) agreed to provide a bond, letter of credit, or other agreeable surety in the amount of the design contract, construction contract, and any other related professional services contracts to be held until the grading for Phase I of the proposed residential development is completed.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of promises and mutual covenants herein contained, the DEVELOPER(S) and the CITY, agree as follows:

- 1. The CITY shall pay no more than \$500,000 of the cost of the survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, and construction & engineering inspections for the sewer lift station, associated force main, and gravity sewer lines on or along the property of the DEVELOPER(S) as set forth in, those project plans identified as ______ (This work shall be referred to herein as "the Project."). The cost of the survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, and construction & engineering inspections for the sewer lift station, associated force main, and gravity sewer lines will be determined after the Project has been completed.
- 2. The DEVELOPER(S) shall pay any expenses exceeding \$500,000.00 of the cost of the survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, and construction & engineering inspections for the Project in two payments (hereinafter referred to as "DEVELOPER's share").
 - a. First, DEVELOPER(S) shall pay their share of the cost by depositing with the CITY a minimum amount equal to fifty percent (50%) of the preliminary estimated share of the DEVELOPER(S).
 - i. The preliminary estimated share will be determined by the CITY and shall be due within thirty (30) days of written notice by the CITY to the DEVELOPER of the amount owed.
 - ii. The DEVELOPER's first payment shall be paid after completion of design plans and bidding but prior to execution of any construction contract.

- b. The second payment of the DEVELOPER(S) share shall be paid to the CITY within ninety (90) days of certification with the State and written notification from the CITY to the DEVELOPER that the project is complete.
 - i. The DEVELOPER's second payment shall be in the amount of the difference between the DEVELOPER's first payment and the actual total Project costs.
 - ii. The DEVELOPER(S) costs will not exceed their share of the actual survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, and construction & engineering inspection costs, and any payment in excess of actual cost will be refunded to the DEVELOPER(S).
- 3. DEVELOPER(S) agrees to provide a bond, letter of credit, or other agreeable surety acceptable to the CITY in the amount of the sum of the design contract, construction contract, and any other related professional services contracts to be held until the grading for Phase I of the residential development is completed. This bond shall be provided prior to the CITY executing the contract for professional services and will be subject to terms set by the CITY in the CITY's sole discretion.
- 4. The contract for the construction of the sewer infrastructure improvements related to this residential development on the property located at 1105 River Road, Shelby, NC and described in Deed Book 1839 Page 1586 at the Cleveland County Register of Deeds shall be let for bids and awarded in accordance with Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the North Carolina General Statutes and applicable federal regulations concerning use of ARP funding, and specifically including the requirement that any contract be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. All obtained bids shall be provided to the DEVELOPER(S) for review. The CITY reserves the right to refuse any and/or all bids. The total CITY share of the Project will not exceed \$500,000.00 of the actual survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, and construction & engineering inspection costs for the most feasible, costefficient solution determined by the CITY for the Project. The DEVELOPER(S) share of the cost of the Project shall consist of the total amount exceeding \$500,000.00 for any survey, design, permitting, bidding, construction, and construction & engineering inspection costs for the most feasible, cost-efficient solution determined by the CITY for the Project including professional and construction costs. Total Project costs shall not exceed \$1,500,000.00. If Project bids exceed \$1,500,000, the scope of the project shall be modified to reduce the total Project costs below the \$1,500,000 limit.
- 5. The DEVELOPER(S) must provide all utility easements required for public infrastructure as part of the sewer infrastructure installed during the Project, at no cost to the CITY.
- 6. The CITY will review and approve the sewer infrastructure design plans and specifications prior to bid solicitation.
- 7. The work shall conform to City standards and other applicable Local, State, and Federal requirements.

- 8. The CITY, or a third party delegated by the CITY, shall provide construction oversight and inspections to ensure that the Project is completed in substantial conformance with the approved plans.
- 9. In consideration for the CITY's undertaking of the sewer lift station, associated force main, and gravity sewer line project on private property, the DEVELOPER(S) hereby agree to discharge, release, and hold harmless the CITY, its agents, employees, and officers, for liability for personal injury or property damage, or both, arising under this Agreement or the work to be performed hereunder. The DEVELOPER(S) hereby agree to discharge, release, and hold harmless the CITY's contractor or contractors for liability for personal injury or property damage, or both, to the extent such are not covered by the contractor's liability insurance.
- 10. The DEVELOPER(S) understands and acknowledges that, in the event the DEVELOPER(S) fails to make full payment for their share in the cost of the Project, or fails to execute all required documents and agreements, the final approval of the Project and acceptance of flow into the sewer lift station will be withheld by the CITY.
- 11. The DEVELOPER agrees to complete the grading plans for the Project and provide those grading plans to the CITY and the CITY's third party consulting engineer within six months of the date of execution of this Agreement.
- 12. The DEVELOPER(S) must begin grading for public infrastructure and the required sewer corridor within nine (9) months of completion of the Sewer Project design.
- 13. The DEVELOPER(S) must have the sewer corridor graded to within six (6) inches of final grade and ensure that the sewer corridor is compacted with material deemed suitable by the CITY and the CITY's third-party engineering consultant for the Sewer Project.
- 14. The CITY agrees to start construction of the Sewer Project within ninety (90) days of final grade of the sewer corridor. Once construction begins, the Sewer Project must be completed within twelve (12) months.
- 15. DEVELOPER(S) shall dedicate to the CITY all public Improvements in the manner specified by the CITY, including all outfalls, pump stations, and other improvements that are to be owned and operated by the CITY. The streets within the Project shall be dedicated as public right of way and shall be constructed in conformance with NCDOT Traditional Neighborhood Street Design Guidelines or similar street design standards by the CITY, unless otherwise required by CITY ordinance or policy. Upon acceptance by City Council by resolution of any dedicated improvements, the CITY shall thereafter be responsible for operation and maintenance. The determination as to whether the Improvements comply with City Requirements shall be made by the CITY'S Director of Engineering Services or designee at his or her sole discretion. The CITY may require, among other things, certified as-built plans for the Improvements; a release of liens from contractors and subcontractors; additional plats or deeds for property containing the Improvements; releases of any mortgage or security interests in such property; and any other information the CITY deems

- to be necessary to accept the constructed Improvements in accordance with CITY policies and ordinances.
- 16. DEVELOPER(S) agree that in accordance with City Requirements, the CITY may make extensions or connections to sewer improvements that it has dedicated to the CITY.
- 17. This Agreement does not create any express or implied obligation that the CITY:
 - a. reserve or create wastewater treatment capacity;
 - b. approve a permit or connection, which shall be granted only upon compliance with all requirements of law, including City Requirements;
 - c. offer utility services to any user within the Project;
 - d. provide a particular quantity, quality, or pressure for the water/wastewater serving the Project; or
 - e. waive or not charge fees that are otherwise applicable to City Requirements.
- 18. DEVELOPER(S) agree that no vested rights exist that would impact the CITY's consideration of its proposed development, and that no vested rights shall be claimed for the proposed development until and unless annexation and zoning are approved by the CITY, if they are approved, and such further development approvals are given as would, under the law, create a claim regarding vested rights.
- 19. All activity undertaken pursuant to this Agreement shall comply with federal and state law and regulations and City requirements. The CITY shall obtain all permits and approvals required to do the work authorized under this Agreement related to the construction of the aforementioned public sewer infrastructure.
- 20. In the event of conflict between this Agreement and any law, state or federal regulation, or City Requirements, the stricter of the applicable provisions shall control.
- 21. The obligations of this Agreement shall become effective upon execution of this Agreement by the parties.
- 22. These provisions represent the entire Agreement between the parties and may not be modified by oral representations. As used herein, the plural designation may indicate the singular, where applicable.
- 23. No action or failure to act by the CITY shall constitute a waiver of any of its rights or remedies that arise out of this Agreement or constitute approval or acquiescence in a breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing.
- 24. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to in any way stop, limit, or impair the CITY from exercising or performing any regulatory, policing, legislative, governmental or other powers or functions, or shall limit the CITY's discretion in the exercise of such powers and functions.

- 25. All matters relating to this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of North Carolina, without regard to its choice of law provisions, and venue for any action related to the Agreement shall be Cleveland County Superior Court or the United States District Court for the Western District of North Carolina, Asheville Division.
- 26. This Agreement shall be binding on the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties with reference to the subject matter of this Agreement.


EXHIBIT A – PRELIMINARY SEWER LAYOUT


INSERT MAP SHOWING SEWER CONCEPT

City of Shelby General Fund Debt Service Fiscal Year 2024


