This time is scheduled on your agenda to allow Chip Nuhrah, City of Shelby Public Information and Communications Officer, to update City Council on the Panhandling project.

As you all know panhandling has become an issue of concern in our community. You may have even received calls from people complaining about them at the entrance to Walmart, Keeter corner, uptown or other places. Some of the folks panhandling are truly in need and others may be professional panhandlers preying on sympathetic people to give them money. Nonetheless, it is an issue of concern. One way that we can address it is to provide people with a way to contribute to non-profit or other entities that will use donations to benefit those in our community that have no place to call home.

Several months ago, it was brought to my attention by a friend that several cities were partnering with non-profit groups to encourage people to give online to help with the needs of some of our most vulnerable citizens. I noticed a sign last year in Wilmington that provided a QR code that took you to a non-profit website that allowed you to make a donation.

Chip is going to tell you about our efforts working with the Shelby Police Department, NCDOT, United Way of Cleveland County, Cleveland County Rescue Mission, the CC Health Department and others to post these signs throughout our community. It is our hope that we can provide people with a better way of helping those truly in need and to track whether it is successful.

WHEREAS, the Shelby City Council has been petitioned by Caleb Peeler under G.S. 160A-31, as amended, to annex the area described herein; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has by resolution directed the City Clerk to investigate the sufficiency of said petition; and,

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has certified the sufficiency of said petition and a public hearing on the question of this annexation was held at the Don Gibson Theatre, 318 South Washington Street, Shelby, North Carolina on April 1, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. after due notice by publication on March 19, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council does hereby find as fact that said petition has been signed by all owners of real property in the area who are required by law to sign and all other requirements of GS 160A-31, as amended, have been satisfied; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council further finds that the petition is otherwise valid, and that the public health, safety and welfare of the City and of the area proposed for annexation, will be best served by annexing the area described herein:

Mayor Anthony called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and delivered the invocation.

Mr. White led the Pledge of Allegiance.

A. Approval of agenda:

1) Motion to adopt the proposed agenda presented.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion by Mr. White, City Council voted unanimously to approve the agenda as presented.

B. Public Comment:

None

C. Public Hearing:

1) Consideration of a proposed ordinance amending the zoning map of the City of Shelby, North Carolina for parcels 62692, 62694, and 32575 (925 Washburn Switch Road): Ordinance No. 20-2024

Mr. Longino presented this item to Council and stated they would have a zoning decision first and an annexation decision after. The zoning would go into effect the following day, March 19th, 2024, if passed. Mr. Longino stated

this parcel is outside of our corporate limits and therefore does not have a City zoning assigned to it. Mr. Longino informed Council that the parcel is the former Hanwha property and consists of approximately 12 acres located at 925 Washburn Switch Road. Mr. Longino stated the applicant has had discussions with our utility staff and wishes to connect to the city sewer and bring the property into the City of Shelby's corporate limits. Mr. Longino further stated that the current zoning is Cleveland County HI (Heavy-Industrial), and the surrounding area is the City of Shelby GI (General-Industrial) and LI (Light-Industrial). Mr. Longino concluded that the proposed zoning is consistent with the future land-use map and the Planning and Zoning Board, and staff recommended this rezoning.

Mayor Anthony opened the public hearing at 6:05 p.m. and invited comments from the public.

There were no comments from the public.

Mayor Anthony closed the public hearing at 6:06 p.m.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. White, City Council voted unanimously to approve Ordinance No. 20-2024 entitled, "A PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, NORTH CAROLINA FOR PARCELS 62692, 62694, and 32575 (925 WASHBURN SWITCH ROAD)" due to it being consistent with the Shelby adopted Comprehensive Land Use Plan based on an approval from the Planning Board. This zoning request is reasonable because the surrounding property is commercial, the planned use is consistent with the area for industrial use, and consistent with Shelby's Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

2) Consideration of an ordinance to extend the corporate limits of the City of Shelby, North Carolina (925 Washburn Switch Road): Ordinance No. 21-2024

Mr. Longino presented this item to the Council and stated that they have an annexation decision for the property they just assigned zoning. Mr. Longino stated that this property is contiguous with the City of Shelby's current limits. Mr. Longino concluded that if passed, this would bring the parcel into the city limits, and the Planning and Zoning board, as well as staff, recommend approving the annexation.

Mayor Anthony opened the public hearing at 6:07 p.m. and invited comments from the public.

There were no comments from the public.

Mayor Anthony closed the public hearing at 6:08 p.m.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion made by Mr. Hopper, City Council voted unanimously to approve Ordinance No. 21-2024 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO EXTEND THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, NORTH CAROLINA".

E. Unfinished Business:

1) Adoption of an ordinance establishing capital project ordinance and budgets for the city of Shelby's First Broad Outfall Sewer Improvement Project: Ordinance No. 23-2024

Mr. Howell stated as background that if approved this ordinance would establish a capital project budget ordinance for this project. Mr. Howell reminded the Council that the City received roughly a \$12,000,000 directed state grant for the replacement of a portion of the First Broad River outfall which serves approximately two-thirds of the City. Mr. Howell concluded that approval of the Ordinance would allow staff to move forward with the project. Mr. Howell called Brian Wilson, Director of Water Resources, to give Council more of a background about this project.

Mr. Wilson stated that the City applied for a grant through the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) to provide the City with about \$12,000,000 of funding. Mr. Wilson stated that the City worked with HDR to identify the First Broad Outfall Replacement Program. Mr. Wilson informed the Council that the City intends to replace roughly 9,000 linear feet of the outfall and increase the size from 24 inches to 36 inches. Mr. Wilson concluded he is available to answer questions if needed.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion by Mr. Webber, the City Council voted unanimously to adopt Ordinance No. 23-2024 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CAPITAL PROJECT ORDINANCE AND BUDGETS FOR THE CITY OF SHELBY'S FIRST BROAD OUTFALL SEWER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT."

F. New Business

1) Adoption of an ordinance amending the City Of Shelby's Schedule of Fees: Ordinance No. 24-2024

Mr. Howell asked Council to recall that each fiscal year Council adopts a schedule of fees and charges as a public document that is part of the City's existing budget document. Mr. Howell stated that periodically from time to time, staff will make recommendations for changes during the fiscal year. Mr. Howell pointed out that the Council is being asked to look at a recommended change this year. Mr. Howell stated that these changes are only recommended when necessary and deemed appropriate for the City and its customers. He further stated that this change reflects the natural gas system and the rates that are charged particularly for industrial customers. Mr. Howell called on Ben Yarboro, Assistant City Manager, to introduce this proposed item.

Mr. Yarboro informed the Council that there were two parts to this proposal. He further stated that the first part reduces the required minimum use volume from 1,000 dekatherms to 500 dekatherms per day for customers to qualify for the Large Industrial Firm Gas Service Rate. Mr. Yarboro stated that the second part would add new terms and conditions to the fee schedule that would provide qualifying industrial customers the opportunity to either opt out of the City's directed gas supply hedge purchase or to direct their own hedges with assistance from city staff. Mr. Yarboro also stated that this would allow customers who are using 500 dekatherms per day or more to opt out of the hedging program, which would allow them to receive daily gas pricing.

ACTION TAKEN: Upon a motion by Mr. Hopper, the City Council voted unanimously to adopt Ordinance No. 23-2024 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF SHELBY'S SCHEDULE OF FEES."

G. City Manager's Report:

- Construction of the new County Home Road segment near the SECU is set to begin as soon as some required electric utility relocation is completed by Duke Energy. Once that work is completed the City's contractor can begin road construction. The estimated completion date is still by the end of May.
- ➤ The City has submitted the required documentation to the NC Office of State Budget Management (OSBM) for the \$3,995,000 directed grant "for the purchase and restoration of the historic home (Webbley) of former Governor O. Max Garder." The final contract document has been executed and the funds have been deposited in the City's bank account. The City Attorney will oversee the closing process for the acquisition of the property from the current owner. Final costs for the purchase and appropriate due diligence are now being finalized. An April 15, 2024, closing date is anticipated.
- Three proposals have been received for the redevelopment of the Hotel Charles. City staff and DFI are now in the process of evaluating the details of each proposal. Once a consensus has been reached the details of each proposal will be presented publicly to City Council for consideration.
- ➤ The City's USDOT RAISE grant application for construction of the remainder of the Carolina Harmony Trail to the SC state line was submitted prior to February 28th. Anticipated grant award

announcements are expected no later than June 27, 2024. The City's request is for \$24,998,438.

Request for Qualifications for firms to conduct the development of a new Comprehensive Land Use Plan will go out in the coming weeks. The current plan was completed in April 2009. A Request for Qualifications has been advertised and sent to a number of firms expressing interest. Statements of qualification are due by April 5, 2024.

Carolina Harmony Trail (Rail Trail)

➤ TGS Engineering continues the design of the remainder of Phase I of the rail trail. This is essentially the section from Marion Street to Dekalb Street (excluding the Depot Park section). This section is tentatively scheduled to go out to bid in the fall of 2024.

Depot Park

Destination by Design is working on the engineering and architectural design for the renovation of the old depot and construction of Depot Park. The design was expected to be complete by the end of the first quarter of 2024. This project has been delayed due to unexpected issues with the requirements we anticipate from NC SHPO related to the Depot.

The Depot building work is a little behind the park bidding process due to a need to address State Historic Preservation Office comments and requirements involving the roof of the depot structure and the adjacent open-air canopy. It is scheduled to be vacated by no later than April 15, 2024.

Aquatics Center

Construction on this project is complete and the facility was open to the public during the 2023 season. Portions of the pool concrete deck are being replaced by the contractor once temperatures allow.

Dog Park

Planning has begun for the development of a dog park on a portion of the former Shelby Middle School ballfield. This 6-acre site is adjacent to and will eventually be accessed from the rail trail. A more detailed schedule will be shared with the Council once the site has been fully evaluated to address stormwater issues. An engineer has been retained to assist with

this project. Some significant stormwater issues will have to be resolved prior to the actual construction of the dog park itself.

TAMP

- Phase I of the implementation of the Transportation Asset Management Plan is nearing completion. Approximately \$2.8 million of the \$10 million street improvement bonds passed by voters in November 2021 have been used in this phase for street resurfacing. Approximately 17 miles of streets have been resurfaced in TAMP Phase I.
- ➢ Planning for Phase II is in process as staff continues plans for viable utility improvements prior to the start of resurfacing in late Winter 2023 / early Spring 2024. Approximately 15 miles of additional resurfacing will be completed by the end of 2024. This brings total street resurfacing to 32 miles. Approximately \$6.0 million of the \$10 million street improvement bonds passed by voters in November 2021 have been used to date for street resurfacing.
- ➤ TAMP Phase III planning is moving forward. Much of this work is contingent on the planning, budgeting, and construction of underground utility repair and replacement projects in advance of resurfacing. This phase would resurface approximately 18 miles. It is proposed for funding from the remaining \$4.0 million in authorized street/sidewalk improvement bonds. A revenue source for repayment of these bonds has not yet been identified.

Cross Town Water Main 24" Transmission Line Phase II (\$8,976,174.) SRP-D-ARP-0030

This project was advertised on April 10, 2023, with a May 17, 2023, bid opening. Construction is expected to begin in March 2024 to allow for material procurement and delivery. This project will extend the 24" diameter water main approximately 9,000 If from the intersection of Marion Street/Morgan Street along S. Morgan Street to Graham Street to the South Tank on S. Lafayette Street and to the intersection with Forest Hill Drive/Beaumonde. Approximately 4,500 If of sewer main in conflict with the line will also be replaced. This is the second of a multiphase project to improve water supply to the south, east, and north of the uptown area. It is intended to improve fire flow, water volume/pressure, and water quality overall in the system. It is a high priority. Substantial completion is expected in May 2025. The statutory completion deadline to expend all funds is December 31, 2026.

 Hickory Creek Sewer Outfall - Windsor Drive to Holly Oak Park (\$4,627,000)
 SRP-W-ARP-0029

Construction on this sewer outfall project has begun. It will replace approximately 5,000 lf of existing sewer outfall with 24" diameter pipe. It runs along Hickory Creek from the end of Windsor Drive to Dixon Blvd. This project replaces an existing sewer outfall that has been plagued with Sanitary Sewer Overflows due to infiltration and inflow. Construction began in August 2023. Substantial completion is expected in June 2024. The statutory deadline to expend all funds is December 31, 2026.

 WTP Filter Rehabilitation & Sedimentation Valve Replacement Project (\$4,133,200.) ARP

This project consists of the rehabilitation and repair of 8 water treatment plant filters as well as the repair/replacement of the sedimentation basin gate and mud valves. Construction began on this project in late 2023. Substantial completion is anticipated in September 2024. The statutory deadline to expend all funds is December 31, 2026.

 First Broad River Sewer Outfall Project (\$12,087,000) State directed grant.

This project provides for the replacement of approximately 9,000 linear feet of 36-inch diameter pipe on a major sewer outfall located on the First Broad River. A number of Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs) have occurred on this line for the past several years during and after heavy rainfall. McGill Associates has been selected as the project engineer and design work is ongoing. The City Council approved the project budget ordinance this evening.

City Hall Campus Projects

- City Council Chambers A scope of work is being developed to renovate the interior of the chambers after the broken water line flooded the room. I anticipate the scope to include a new sound system, camera system, addition of a video display system, carpet replacement, furnishings, ADA bathroom upgrades, lighting improvements as well as other improvements.
- City Hall Annex This project is expected to be bid on in March. Upland Architecture has largely completed the design. This project will involve the relocation of personnel from the Planning and Development Services Department (Planning/Zoning, Code Enforcement, and Building Inspections) and the Human Resources Department to the former SPD building.

Airport – As you know the City has maintained a goal to make the airport a self-sustainable operation for many years. As the City has made investments in revenue-generating projects such as T-Hangars and fuel sale facilities this has come closer to reality. The City has been successful in receiving a number of NC Division of Aviation grants for a variety of projects including these revenue-generating developments. These have all contributed to making Shelby airport somewhere owners/pilots want to base their aircraft. This in turn results in an increase in the personal property tax base of the City as well as increased property tax receipts.

As such the latest Airport Layout Plan adopted by City Council in April 2023 identified a number of future improvements that will allow the City to move the airport even closer to self-sufficiency. One such project involves the extension of the taxiway toward the east allowing for the construction of additional corporate aircraft hangars. Due to the potential for investment by private owners in a couple of new hangars, the City is moving towards securing grant funding for the infrastructure necessary for this to occur. More details on this will hopefully be forthcoming in the next 60 days or so.

Budget Workshops FY 24-25 (April)

As a matter of practice City Council has scheduled two budget workshops during the month of April for me to present my initial balanced budget and recommendations. One meeting covers the General Fund and other minor funds and the other all of the Enterprise Funds. It is that time. The suggested range of dates is Monday, April 29 through Friday, May 3.

H. Council Announcements and Remarks:

Mrs. Bullock announced that the Grand Opening of her new location Hive Coffee will be on Saturday, March 23rd from 9:00 AM until 12:00 PM.

Mayor Anthony mentioned that he has received many great comments about the Carolina Harmony Trail and that he appreciates all that the staff has done.

City Manager's Recommendation / Comments

Ordinance No. 26-2024 is presented for City Council via the Consent Agenda. If approved this ordinance would appropriate funding to pay the annual debt service payment to Cleveland County for the loan associated with utility improvements necessary for "Project Grizzly" (Clearwater Paper S2 expansion). Funds are generated through the new utility customer and tax revenue paid by Clearwater Paper S2.

Council will recall that these loan proceeds were used to provide a 24" diameter water loop from the Water Treatment Plant to Washburn Switch Road, construction of a 750,000 gallon elevated water storage tank with pump station, construction of a 24" diameter sewer outfall and the looping of a 6" steel natural gas line. This loan along with grant funding of almost \$11 million from the Golden Leaf Foundation, the NC Commerce CDBG and IDF programs and the US Economic Development Administration and an \$8 million contribution from Clearwater Paper put the City in a position to attract this major investment of more than \$330,000,000 and over 180 new jobs.

This is payment number 7 of 15 at an interest rate of 3.25%. This year's payment amount to \$1,006,034. The payment is divided proportionally from the General Fund, Water Fund, Sewer Fund, Electric Fund and Natural Gas Fund.

It is my recommendation that Resolution No. 26-2024 be adopted and approved by City Council at this time via the Consent Agenda.

Background:

The City of Shelby and Cleveland County entered into an interlocal agreement on April 3, 2017, through Resolution 24-2017. This agreement, among other things, detailed the amount of financial participation from the City to provide utility infrastructure to Project Grizzly (Clearwater Paper expansion) and set this limit at \$11,064,000. This amount would initially come in the form of a loan from Cleveland County, which the City would repay over a term not to exceed 15 years, at a rate of interest not to exceed 3.25%.

This budget amendment will allow for repayment of year 7 of the loan, in the amount of \$1,006,034.

The interlocal agreement and debt repayment schedule are attached as reference.

Recommendation:

The recommendation from staff is to approve the attached budget amendment so that the requested debt payment can be made.

Cleveland County, North Carolina Interlocal Agreement Amortization Schedule City of Shelby – North Shelby

As part of a consolidated 2017 installment financing agreement between Cleveland County, North Carolina, (the County), and Capital One Public Finance the County secured funding in the amount of \$11,000,000 in principal to finance the construction of a new public utility infrastructure on behalf of the City of Shelby, North Carolina, (the City).

The City shall have the option to prepay any amount of outstanding principal plus accrued interest at any time. In the event of a partial prepayment of the outstanding principal component the repayment schedule shall be recalculated as necessary in order to reflect the effect of such payment.

The debt issuance costs are shared proportionally based on the principal percentage of the borrowings. The City of Shelby's portion is \$64,000. The County's total investment in the land that was included in the project was \$2,044,767 and the City's portion of that is \$1,022,383. The County will allot the entire \$11,064,000, less amount to be provided for shared land costs which amounts to \$10,041,617 on any date after the review and signing of this document. The City will make annual payments to the County on May 1st of each year beginning May 1, 2019. The 2018 payment will be interest only. The financing will be for a 15 year term at coupon rate of 3.25%. These payments can be made via wire or done through other financial exchange. The method of payment will be a mutually agreed on decision by the City Manager and the County Manager annually during the budget process. See attached for scheduled debt payment amounts. Modification of any term of this agreement will be placed in writing and signed by both parties.

CITY OF SHELBY FY 2023-2024 BUDGET ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable provisions of the North Carolina Budget and Fiscal Control Act, the City of Shelby finds it advisable and necessary to revise and amend its annual budget for FY 2023-2024; and,

WHEREAS, the City Manager (Budget Officer) has recommended certain amendments to the budget which the governing body finds acceptable; and,

WHEREAS, City Council now desires to act on the recommended budget amendments and approve same for implementation and compliance with the Fiscal Control Act;

City Manager's Recommendation / Comments

Ordinance No. 27-2024 is presented for consideration by City Council via the Consent Agenda. It is considered a routine financial matter as it is a legally obligated payment provided for by an agreement between the City and the County. The City and Cleveland County entered into an interlocal agreement on January 3, 2022. The agreement, among other things, detailed the amount of financial participation from the City to construct Shell Building #4. This amount would initially come in the form of a loan from Cleveland County, which the City would repay over a term not to exceed 10 years, at a rate of interest not to exceed 2.39%. These funds are being paid from past sales proceeds from the other shell buildings and held within the Electric Fund.

As you know the City has taken the lead acting as the developer in all four shell buildings thus far. In the case of Shell #4 the County Manager offered for the County to finance the entire project with the City reimbursing an equal share of the annual debt service. In order for the County to enter into a loan arrangement required the property be deeded to the County by the City.

It is my recommendation that Ordinance No. 27-2024 be adopted and approved by City Council at this time via the Consent Agenda.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MOU") CONCERNING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF RANDOLPH ROAD SHELL BUILDING #4 BETWEEN

CLEVELAND COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA ("COUNTY") AND

THE CITY OF SHELBY, NORTH CAROLINA (CITY")

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to outline the Parties' responsibilities concerning economic development of the herein-described Project.

II. DEFINITIONS

- A. "City" means the City of Shelby, North Carolina.
- B. "County" means Cleveland County, North Carolina.
- C. "MOU" means this Memorandum of Understanding.
- D. "Project" means the Parties' joint undertaking to construct and develop, and sale of, a shell building on the Property for the purpose of economic development.
- E. "Property" means the property on which the Project is to be undertaken, specifically the property labeled as "Tract 2" on the survey attached hereto as 'Exhibit A'. While that survey shows the property as being owned by the City of Shelby, the City shall convey the Property to the County. The Property is also known as the "Randolph Road Property" and/or "Shell Building #4".

III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF COUNTY

- A. Sharing of Costs. The County will share in the costs of planning, design, construction, marketing, sale and transfer at fifty (50) percent as described in Section V. below.
- B. Financing. Subject to the approval of the Board of Commissioners, the County will provide financing for the Project through installment contract as described in N.C.G.S. § 160A-20(g).

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF CITY

A. Sharing of Costs. The City will share in the cost of planning, design, construction, marketing, sale and transfer at fifty (50) percent, as discussed in Section V. below.

- B. Project Management. The City will provide Project Management for the Project and upon successful completion (sale) of the Project the City will receive \$80,000 for management fees.
- C. Utility Selection. The City of Shelby will be the utility service provider for water and sewer, gas, electric and natural gas at the Property. The City will be paid its customary rates for the aforementioned services.

V. PROCESS FOR SHARING OF COSTS

- A. The City will receive invoices from Project vendors and, upon approval pay such invoices to such vendors.
- B. After paying a Project invoice to a vendor, the City will send the invoice, City approval, and evidence of payment to the County as a request for reimbursement.
- C. Upon receipt of such a Project reimbursement request from the City, the County will pay to the City the entire amount of the invoice.
- D. Upon completion of the Project, the City will be responsible for fifty (50) percent of the total Project costs.
- F. If any debt service payments come due on the County's installment financing prior to the sale of the Property, the City shall reimburse the County for fifty percent (50%) of such debt service payments.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Amendments. This MOU may be amended by written consent of both parties, and all amendments shall be attached to this MOU.
- B. **Termination.** This MOU may be terminated by either party on sixty (60) days' written notice to the other party.
- C. Consideration. No consideration is exchanged pursuant to this MOU, and this MOU shall not be considered a contract giving rise to binding obligations between the Parties.
- VII. EFFECTIVE DATE shall be the 3rd day of January 2022.

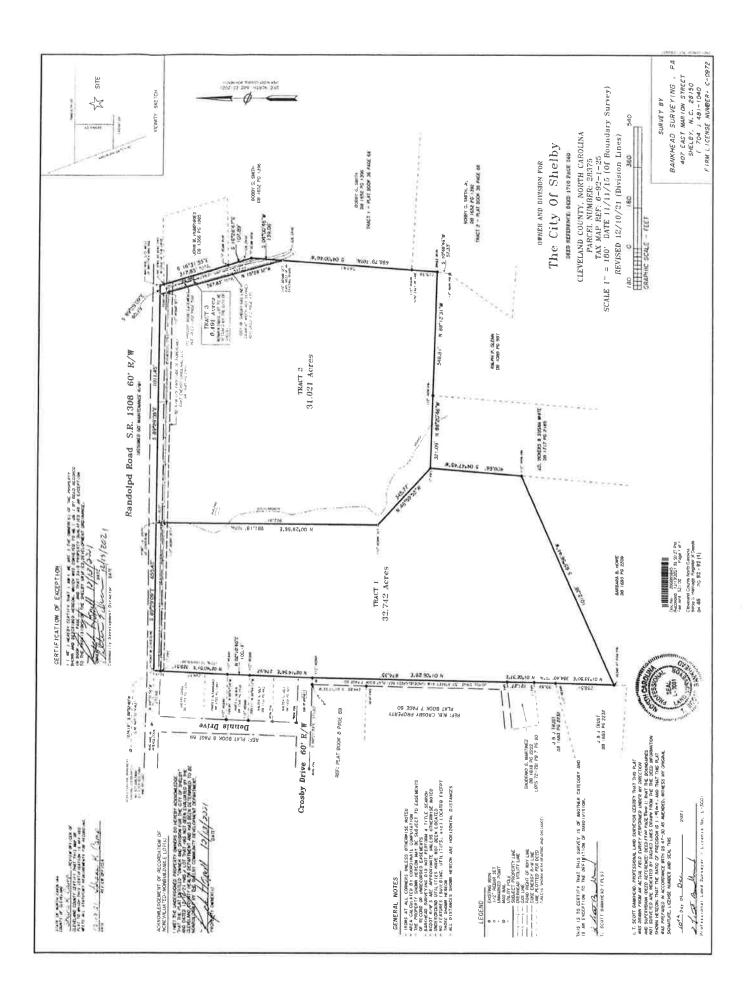

- a) Ordinance No. 30-2024 is presented for City Council consideration via the Consent Agenda as a matter of routine business. If approved this ordinance would appropriate at total of \$425,600 for this project. Background

An Internet Fiber Company named Ripple Fiber has applied for multiple encroachments on City and NCDOT maintained streets. In reviewing this staff found that the path Ripple Fiber was taking routes that would benefit the City in establishing a fiber system that would expand connection to other facilities along with looping current fiber network. The proposed routes largely follow the fiber master plan that established in 2022 by Fiber Planners. In doing this it would follow the concept of the fiber masterplan to expand to utilities while also providing more supported and looped fiber network.

Review

The proposed agreement is attached to the Memorandum and will install approximately 36,522 LF feet of conduit. In this agreement appendix A shows the unit cost breakdown along with a map attached showing the location of the conduit that will be installed. City Staff is asking to allow for a 10% contingency on the Project Budget ordinance to allow for unforeseen issues in installation process.

THIS AGREEMENT FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF T	FELECOMMUNICATIONS			
PIPELINE INSTALLATION (this "Agreement") dated	, 2024 (the "Effective			
Date") is made by and between RIPPLE FIBER, INC., a South Ca	rolina corporation ("Ripple")			
and THE CITY OF SHELBY, a North Carolina municipal corpor	ration ("Shelby"). "Ripple"			
and "Shelby," collectively are referred to hereinafter as the "Parties."				

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, pursuant to certain encroachment agreements entered into by and between Ripple and Shelby (collectively, the "Encroachment Agreements"), Ripple intends to install certain telecommunications infrastructure (the "Ripple Infrastructure") within certain roadway rights-of-way located within the City of Shelby;

WHEREAS, Shelby desires for Ripple to install an additional 2" pipeline alongside the Ripple Infrastructure to be owned and used by Shelby for purposes of certain life safety and other public needs (the "Shelby Pipeline");

WHEREAS, Ripple is amenable to installing the Shelby Pipeline subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. **RECITALS.** The recitals listed above are true and correct and are expressly incorporated into this Agreement.
- **SHELBY PIPELINE.** The Shelby Pipeline shall consist of approximately 36,522¹ linear feet of 2" high-density polyethylene (HDPE) to be installed within the same rightsof-way as and alongside the Ripple Infrastructure. Shelby reserves the right to inspect, select or otherwise approve of the quality of any materials to be used by Ripple for the Shelby Pipeline; provided, however, no such right shall delay Ripple in its installation of the Ripple Infrastructure or the adjacent Shelby Pipeline. Further, where Ripple requests in writing (which email shall be sufficient) for approval from Shelby with respect to certain materials to be used for the Shelby Pipeline and Shelby fails to approve or disapprove such materials in writing within five (5) business days of such request, such materials shall be deemed approved. Subject to Section 3, following installation of the Shelby Pipeline and reimbursement by Shelby of all Costs (as defined below) pursuant Section 4 below, Shelby shall be the sole owner of the Shelby Pipeline and shall have all rights with respect thereto. Upon completion of the Shelby Pipeline, or portions thereof, and notice by Ripple to Shelby with respect thereto pursuant to Section 14 of this Agreement, Shelby will assume all liability and responsibility for the maintenance, repair and replacement of the Shelby Pipeline, or such completed portions thereof, which such obligation shall exist independent of Shelby's obligation to pay all Costs or applicable portion thereof.

- 3. <u>USE OF THE SHELBY PIPELINE.</u> Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, use of the Shelby Pipeline shall be restricted and limited to government entities within Cleveland County, to include, but not limited to, Cleveland County, Cleveland County Schools, and municipal governments duly authorized and recognized by the State of North Carolina at the sole discretion of the City of Shelby. No third-party private entity shall have access to or use of the Shelby pipeline without prior written consent of Ripple. Shelby acknowledges that the foregoing restrictions are a material inducement to Ripple's willingness to install the Shelby Pipeline pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. REIMBURSEMENT. Shelby shall reimburse Ripple for any and all out-ofpocket cost incurred by Ripple to design, construct and install the Shelby Pipeline (collectively, the "Costs"); provided, however, to the extent the Costs, in the aggregate, shall exceed the aggregated budgeted amount set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto, such excess shall be subject to Shelby's prior approval, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. Where Ripple requests in writing (which email shall be sufficient) for approval from Shelby with respect to any additional, non-budgeted Costs pursuant to this Section 4 and Shelby fails to approve or disapprove such additional Costs in writing within five (5) business days of such request, such additional Costs shall be deemed approved and subject to reimbursement pursuant to this Section 4. All Costs, or portions thereof, shall be payable within thirty (30) days following delivery of an invoice from Ripple with respect thereto, which such invoices shall be submitted by Ripple to Shelby not more than once every thirty (30) days. If Shelby shall fail to pay when due any amounts payable pursuant to this Agreement, in addition to any other rights and remedies available to Ripple at law, Ripple shall have the right to immediately cease installation of the Shelby Pipeline.
- 5. RIPPLE INSURANCE. Ripple shall purchase and maintain adequate insurance during the life of this Agreement with a company authorized to do business in the State of North Carolina. Shelby shall be named as an additional insured under the commercial general liability insurance for operations and services rendered and auto liability insurance under this Agreement. If any part of the work under this Agreement is sublet, Ripple shall require the subcontractor(s) to carry insurance as required above. Each policy described herein shall provide that Shelby shall receive not less than thirty (30) days prior written notice of any cancellation or non-renewal of coverage of any of the policies. Upon notice of such cancellation, non-renewal or if a policy's limits are exhausted, Ripple shall procure substitute insurance so as to assure the Shelby that the minimum limits of coverage are maintained continuously throughout the periods of instillation.
- 6. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>. Except to the extent arising out of Shelby's negligence or willful misconduct, Ripple shall indemnify and hold harmless Shelby and its agents from and against any and all claims of damage of any kind including, but not limited to, damage or injury to the person or property of anyone or any entity arising from any act, omission or performance of or non-performance by Ripple or its contractor(s) of its obligations under this Agreement including, but not limited to, the defense or pursuit of any claim or any action or proceeding with respect thereto, and in case any action or proceeding is brought against Shelby by reason of any such matter, then in such event, Ripple or its contractor(s), upon notice from Shelby in accordance with Section 14 of this Agreement, shall defend Shelby at Ripple's expense. Shelby need not have first paid any such claim in order to be so indemnified. This indemnification shall expressly survive

expiration or termination of this Agreement.

- 7. **RECORDING.** Any party may cause this Agreement or a memorandum thereof to be recorded in the Register of Deeds Office for Cleveland County.
- 8. <u>ELECTRONIC VERSION OF CONTRACT</u>. Shelby may convert a signed original of this Agreement to an electronic record pursuant to a North Carolina Department of Natural Resources approved procedure and process for converting paper records to electronic records for record retention purposes. Such electronic record of this Agreement shall be deemed for all purposes to be an original signed contract.
- 9. **PERFORMANCE OF GOVERNMENT FUNCTIONS**. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to in any way stop, limit, or impair Shelby from exercising or performing any regulatory, policing, legislative, governmental or other powers or functions, or shall limit Shelby's discretion in the exercise of such powers and functions.
- 10. <u>APPLICABLE LAW</u>. This Agreement shall be construed by and under the laws of the State of North Carolina and venue for any action related to this Agreement shall be Cleveland County Superior Court or the United States District Court for the Western District of North Carolina, Asheville Division.
- 11. **PARTIAL INVALIDITY.** In the event that any paragraph or portion of this Agreement is determined to be unconstitutional, unenforceable or invalid, such paragraph or portion of this Agreement shall be stricken from and construed for all purposes not to constitute a part of this Agreement, and the remaining portions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and shall, for all purposes, constitute this entire Agreement.
- 12. <u>CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT</u>. The Parties hereto acknowledge that they have had the benefit of independent counsel with regard to this Agreement and that this Agreement has been prepared as a result of the joint efforts of the Parties and their respective counsel. Accordingly, the Parties agree that the provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed or interpreted for or against any party hereto based upon authorship.
- 13. <u>COUNTERPARTS</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall be an original, but all such counterparts shall constitute one and the same agreement.
- 14. **PARTIES.** The rights and obligations hereunder shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto, their heirs, successors, and assigns. The use of any gender shall be deemed to refer to the appropriate gender, whether masculine, feminine or neuter, and the singular shall be deemed to refer to the plural where appropriate, and vice versa.
- 15. <u>NOTICES</u>. All notices, demands and requests given or made in connection with this Agreement shall be made in a writing signed by the party serving the same, and hand delivered, or sent by nationally recognized overnight delivery services (receipt requested), and shall be addressed to:

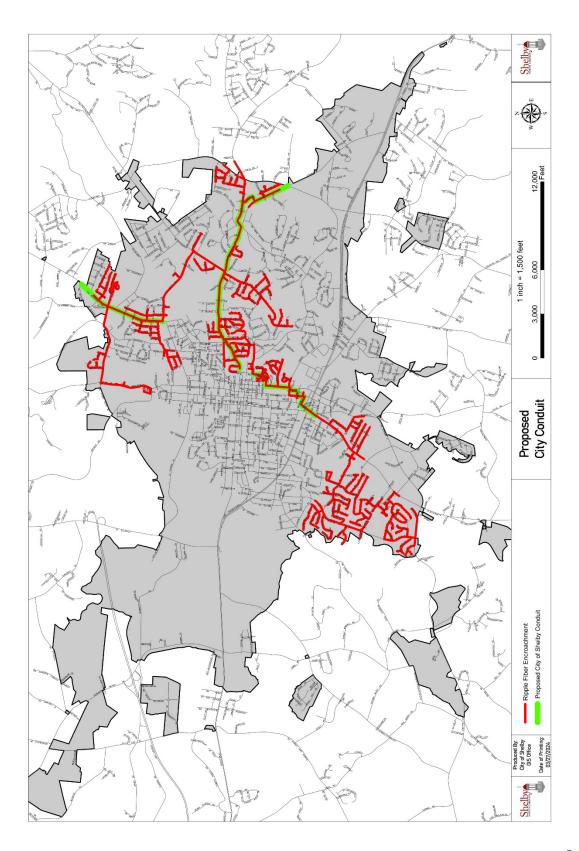

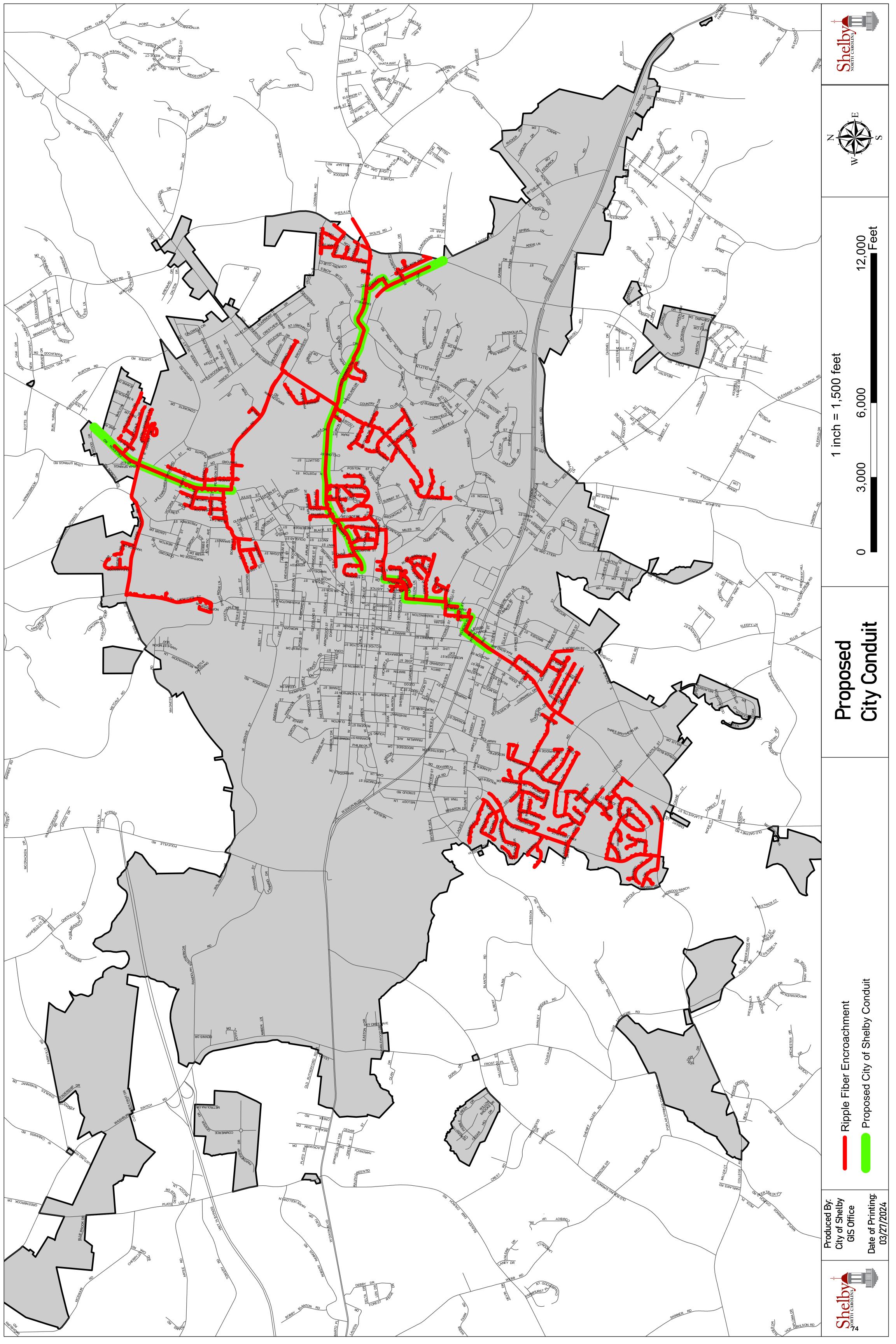

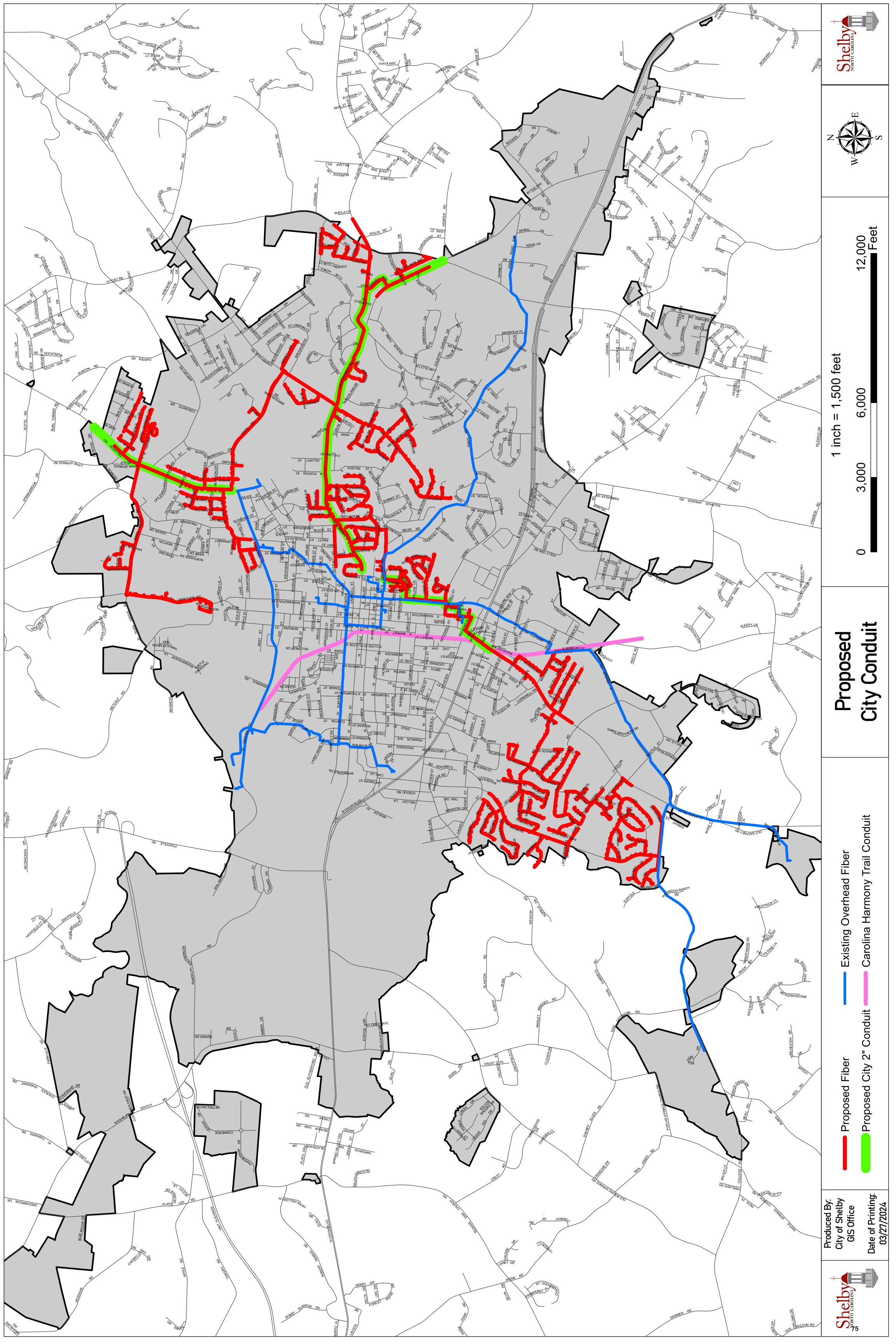

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CAPITAL PROJECT ORDINANCE AND BUDGETS FOR THE CITY OF SHELBY'S TELECOMMUNICATIONS PIPELINE INSTALLATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable provisions of the North Carolina Budget and Fiscal Control Act, the City of Shelby finds it advisable and necessary to establish a capital project ordinance and budgets for the City of Shelby's Telecommunications Pipeline Installation Project: and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City to establish a budget for this capital project and appropriate applicable funds needed for the administration and construction of this project in order to comply with applicable provisions of the North Carolina Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act; and,

WHEREAS, G.S. 159-13.2 provides that a City may undertake the construction of a capital asset such as fiber infrastructure, by way of a capital project ordinance providing the necessary balanced budget and funding for the life of the project;
