Independence Day Safety Tips



It's that time of year when Americans everywhere will be celebrating the Fourth of July holiday with family, friends and fireworks. The Shelby Fire and Rescue Department would like to remind you to follow these important tips for a safe and fun holiday.

- Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks, including sparklers. Sparklers burn at temperatures of about 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit—hot enough to melt some metals.
- Never point or throw fireworks (including sparklers) at anyone.
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy, in case of fire or other mishap.
- Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.

The City of Shelby's Fire and Rescue Department has earned the distinction of an ISO Class 1 rating. This is the highest rating a fire and rescue department can achieve and represents years of continuous improvement in fire and rescue services as well as the City's water system.

An ISO (Insurance Services Office) rating is given to cities and towns across the country indicating how prepared they are for fires, and is graded on a scale of 1-10, with 1 representing communities with the most effective fire service capabilities, and 10 representing communities with the least effective fire service capabilities.

Of the 1,217 fire departments across North Carolina, only 30 have achieved the designation of an ISO 1 rating, and there are only 373 departments in the country that have obtained an ISO 1 class rating.

Street Resurfacing Project



The City of Shelby currently owns and maintains approximately 125.5 miles of City streets.

In 2021, voters approved a bond by a measure of 708 to 195, which has allowed the city to dramatically increase the amount of money it spends repaving cracked and damaged streets.

24" WATER MAIN PROJECT

In 2009, the City of Shelby identified low water pressure and low flow issues in the eastern portion of the water distribution system. The system was able to meet normal consumption needs and smaller fire protection. The water system from Uptown Shelby to the East tank is generally made up of smaller diameter lines creating issues with filling of the East tank.

A new 24" water transmission line to the East tank would continue to improve distribution flow to this area and reduce system stress during high demand through use or fire protection. These current problems also present a problem for increased water usage and economic development. Over the course of the last few years, there has been growth in commercial development and the expansion of Cleveland Community College, and the City is beginning to see additional development to the East. Due to the age of the sewer system, it was also beneficial to replace sewer along the route at this time.

This project consists of construction of 8,748 LF of 24" water transmission main, 4,033 LF of gravity sewer, 603 LF of 8" water main along with altitude valves for the North and South Tank to better distribute water through the system.

Shelby has joined other local communities around the state in creating a social district.

City Council has approved an amended ordinance which will allow people to carry special cups of alcohol in designated areas in uptown Shelby and to walk from one store front to another.

Local businesses can choose to participate or not, and window clings will be displayed in their windows identifying their level of participation. Some businesses may sell, allow or not permit people to carry in drinks. The social district is available seven days a week, Monday through Sunday from 10 am to 10 pm.
