This time is scheduled on the agenda for City Council to conduct the required public hearing in accordance with the NC General Statute Chapter 158. This hearing has been duly advertised as required by law. Subsequent to the hearing a resolution and agreement for City Council has been prepared for consideration at the regular meeting to be held Monday, October 7, 2024. That resolution will generally propose the following:

- 1. Project Gui agrees to invest no less than \$286,506,000 within the city limits creating approximately 113 new jobs with an average annual compensation of \$61,984 over the next 4 years.
- 2. The City agrees to make 5 annual incentive grant payments in an amount equaling 20% of the City's tax levy on the actual net new assessed investment made by Project Gui, an estimated value of \$979,410.15 over 5 years.

After the conclusion of the public hearing City Council may act upon Resolution No. 60-2024. It is my recommendation that Resolution No. 60-2024 be adopted and approved by City Council at this time.

#### **SUMMARY STATEMENT:**

- Project Gui is a major manufacturing employer who is considering expansion in Shelby, as
  well as at least one location in South Carolina. Logistics, available land, and the overall cost
  of doing business are drivers for this new location and expansion.
- 113 new jobs over five years with \$61,984 as an average wage.
- \$286,506,000.00 in real and personal property investment over 4 years.
- The City is proposing tax incentives of twenty percent (20%) over five (5) years at a value of nine hundred seventy-nine thousand four hundred ten dollars and fifteen cents (\$979,410.15).

#### **PROPOSAL:**

North Carolina Department of Commerce has authorized Project Gui to apply for a OneNC Grant from the State as well as tax grants from the County and the City of Shelby. Given the extent of the proposed investment and creation of the 113 new jobs, it is recommended that the City approve the proposed tax incentives.

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 158-7.1, the City, following a public hearing, may offer economic incentives to a company seeking to expand or locate within NC. Project Gui's proposed location and expansion in Shelby will add to the tax base and provide economic growth as well as stability to the tax base. The additional jobs, paying an average wage above the county average, will also aid in the growth of the tax base as well as growth to the city itself and surrounding businesses.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Following the public hearing on October 7, 2024, it is recommended that City Council approve a resolution entitled: **RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PROJECT GUI ECONOMIC INCENTIVES** because the incentives will help to attract the business to locate within Shelby, NC. Additionally, the expansion will bring 113 new full time jobs, \$286,506,000.00 in net new real and personal property tax base over 4 years, and it will add stability and diversity to the local economy. Such growth and expansion will also aid in the growth of the City as a whole and surrounding businesses.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 60-2024**

#### RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PROJECT GUI ECONOMIC INCENTIVES

WHEREAS, following a public hearing pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 158-7.1, City Council for the City of Shelby, North Carolina determined that Project Gui intends to create one hundred thirteen (113) new full-time jobs over the next five years with an average annual wage of sixty-one thousand nine hundred eighty-four dollars (\$61,984.00); and

WHEREAS, over the next four years, Project Gui plans to create approximately two hundred eighty-six million five hundred six thousand dollars (\$286,506,000.00) in net new investment comprising of both real and personal property, which will contribute to population growth, an increase in taxable property, and overall expansion of business generating increased revenues for the City; and

WHEREAS, Project Gui chose to expand in Shelby, NC based on the twenty percent (20%) tax incentive offered by the City of Shelby valued at nine hundred seventy-nine thousand four hundred ten dollars and fifteen cents (\$979,410.15) over five years based on the proposed job creation and investment in net new real and personal property; and

WHEREAS, given the planned expansion within the City of Shelby, Project Gui will contribute to increases in the City's utilities to include increases in water, electricity, natural gas, and sewer; and

WHEREAS, the proposed expansion and accompanying incentives will aid the public through increased tax revenues, diversification of the local economy, and job creation by investing in real and personal property totaling two hundred eighty-six million five hundred six thousand dollars (\$286,506,000.00).

## NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council for the City of Shelby, North Carolina:

Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to enter into negotiations to enter a formal contract agreement with Project Gui pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 158-7.1 for the purpose of providing economic incentives as outlined above at twenty percent (20%) over five years, which are intended to encourage expansion within the City of Shelby and the creation of new jobs.

Section 2. The Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Shelby are hereby authorized to execute the agreement specified in section 1 of this resolution on behalf of the City of Shelby.

Section 3. This resolution shall become effective upon its adoption and approval.

- 1. The City proposes to convey 30.724 acres (parcel 28375 located at 2215 Randolph Road), and 1.61 acres (parcel 58270 located at 376 Washburn Switch Road) for an economic development project which it believes will stimulate and stabilize the local economy resulting in the creation of new and permanent good paying jobs within the city limits. The proposed sale price has been determined to be \$500,000.00.
- 2. Project Gui proposes to purchase said parcel paying the full cost at closing for the purpose of expansion of its manufacturing operation.

#### **SUMMARY STATEMENT:**

- Project Gui is a major manufacturing employer who is considering expansion in Shelby, as well as at least one location in South Carolina. Logistics, available land, and the overall cost of doing business are drivers for this new location and expansion.
- 113 new jobs over five years with \$61,984.00 as an average wage.
- \$286,506,000.00 in real and personal property investment over 4 years.
- The City is proposing sale of the property at 2215 Randolph Road and further identified by Tax Parcel No. 28375, comprising of approximately 30.724 acres as well as property located at 376 Washburn Switch Road and further identified by Tax Parcel 58270, comprising of approximately 1.61 acres at a fair market value of \$500,000.00 and the company has agreed to pay that price.

#### **PROPOSAL:**

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 158-7.1, the City, following a public hearing, may offer to sell real property to a company seeking to expand or locate within NC for the purpose of attracting and securing that company to invest in North Carolina. Here, the City owns over 31 acres of land within the city limits and the parcels are connected to City utilities. The City has a fair market value of the land at \$500,000.00 and the company has agreed to pay this price. In contemplation of the sale, the City has considered the proposed creation of 113 new full-time jobs over the next five years at an average wage of \$61,984.00. Additionally, Project Gui's proposed location and expansion in Shelby will add to the tax base and provide economic growth as well as stability to the tax base. The additional jobs, paying an average wage above the county average, will also aid in the growth of the tax base as well as growth to the city itself and surrounding businesses. Moreover, the business will be using City utilities in its everyday operations, further adding to the growth of the City's base.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Following the public hearing on October 7, 2024, it is recommended that City Council approve a resolution entitled: RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PROJECT GUI LAND SALE because the sale of the land will help to attract the business to locate within Shelby, NC. Additionally, Project Gui proposes creating 113 new full-time jobs, \$286,506,000.00 in net new real and personal property tax base over 4 years, and will add stability and diversity to the local economy. WHEREAS, Project Gui plans to create one hundred thirteen (113) new full-time jobs over the next five years with an average annual wage of sixty-one thousand nine hundred eighty-four dollars (\$61,984.00); and

WHEREAS, over the next four years, Project Gui plans to create approximately two hundred eighty-six million five hundred six thousand dollars (\$286,506,000.00) in net new investment comprising of both real and personal property, which will contribute to population growth, an increase in taxable property, and overall expansion of business generating increased revenues for the City; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that approving this sale will benefit the City of Shelby and its citizens by stimulating the economy as well as offering stability to the local economy through an increase in sales tax revenues, increased personal property tax revenues, increased purchases of local goods and services, increased revenues from having the project as an expanding customer of the City for water and sewer services, electric, and natural gas service, and the creation of a substantial number of new full-time permanent jobs.

## NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council for the City of Shelby, North Carolina:

Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to enter into negotiations to enter a formal contract agreement with Project Gui to sell the above identified property at the agreed upon price pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 158-7.1 and based on the planned creation of one hundred thirteen (113) new jobs over five years and two hundred eighty-six million five hundred six thousand dollars (\$286,506,000.00) in net new investment comprising of both real and personal property.

Section 2. The Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Shelby are hereby authorized to execute the agreement specified in section 1 of this resolution on behalf of the City of Shelby.

Ordinance No. 62-2024 is presented for City Council at this time via the Consent Agenda. If approved Ordinance No. 62-2024 would authorize the appropriation of an additional \$129,000 from the General Fund – unassigned fund balance. These funds will be used to pay unexpected costs related to the building renovation taking place in the City Hall Annex building. This includes removal of tiles floors on both floors and replacement of a collapsed sewer line under the slab that was discovered during construction. This amendment will bring the total construction cost to \$2,010,000.

Anticipated completion of this project is still expected in May 2025. This facility will house building inspections, code enforcement, planning & zoning, economic development, human resources/risk management.

It is my recommendation that Resolution No. 62-2024 be adopted and approved by the City Council via the Consent Agenda.

SUBJECT: Project Budget Amendment – City Hall Annex

In June of this year, Neill Construction began renovating the City Hall Annex building (former Police Dept). Since that time, several unexpected issues have been identified within the building. One issue resulted in the need to remove tiling from both floors of the building. It was also discovered that the sewer line under the concrete slab of the building had cracked and needed to be replaced. This was verified by our Water Resources Department.

Due to these unexpected issues and expenses, I'm asking that an additional \$129,000 be allocated to the City Hall Annex project. This will bring the total construction cost to \$2,010,000.

A budget ordinance amendment is attached to this email for Council's consideration.

#### Background

Officer David Karl Gemes was hired by the City of Shelby as a law enforcement officer on May 2, 1996. On October 1, 2024, Officer Gemes retired after twenty-eight years of honorable service to the Shelby Police Department and our community. During his tenure with the Shelby Police Department, Officer Gemes served in many roles, including Patrol Officer, Criminal Investigations Division Detective, CALEA (Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc.) Accreditation Manager, G.R.E.A.T. (Gang Resistance Education and Training) Program Officer, and most recently served as a School Resource Officer. Officer Gemes was well known and respected both within the department and in our community. 



#### City Manager's Recommendation / Comments

Resolution No. 63-2024 is presented for City Council consideration as unfinished business. Council will recall that the City received an appropriation within the state budget through the 2023 Appropriations Act (S.L. 2023-134) for wastewater collection system improvements. This resolution would simply accept the direct appropriation and the revised amount of \$12,274,578, accept the conditions and assurances to the NC DEQ and authorize the City Manager to execute other required documents.

I do want to mention the importance of this project again. Our Water Resources Department, led by Brian Wilson, continue to do an excellent job using the financial resources provided. I know I have mentioned the value of the investments made to both our water and sewer systems. Much of these coming in the last 10-15 years. They have been carefully planned and constructed. This project is no exception.

#### **Background**

The City of Shelby was approved for grant funding through 2023 Appropriations Act established in S.L. 2023-134. With approval of this funding, the City of Shelby identified a project that met the criteria for the funding for water/wastewater infrastructure needs. The project selected for use of these funds is the First Broad River Outfall Sewer Improvements Project. This project would consist of the construction of approximately 8,000 LF of 36-inch gravity sewer and approximately 40 manholes to replace aging infrastructure and provide increased sewer capacity for West Shelby.

On July 22, 2024, The City of Shelby received a letter from the State of North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) – Division of Water Infrastructure (DWI) revising the initial fund offer to increase the amount by \$186,923. This increase was due to DWI decreasing their administrative fee from 3% to 1.5%. The revised amount for the First Broad River Outfall Improvements is now \$12,274,578.

#### Review

Upon acceptance of the funding, the City of Shelby must submit the following items to the Division of Water Infrastructure: a resolution adopted by the governing body which accepts the offer and makes the applicable assurances therein contained, a signed copy of the offer and acceptance document, a federal identification number memo, and a sales tax reimbursement certification form. Once all documents have been submitted, the City of Shelby will be eligible for reimbursement for engineering and construction costs related to the First Broad River Outfall Improvements Project.

#### Recommendation

The recommendation from Water Resources Staff is to approve the attached resolution to accept the 2023 Appropriations Act Grant offer in the amount \$12,274,578 for engineering and construction related to the City of Shelby First Broad River Outfall Sewer Improvements Project.


